The author contends that the sovereignty of a state and the existence of an international legal system akin to domestic legal frameworks are inherently incompatible. This incongruity is reconciled through the theory of consent, asserting that the binding nature of international

legal norms arises from the acceptance, whether explicit or implicit, by states. Consequently, being bound by ~~states & persons~~ international law is construed as a manifestation of exercising sovereignty. The author concludes that international law, expressing both state sovereignty & its limitations, seeks to harmonise sovereign states while preserving international order.
