Early life

Shah Walli-Ullah's real name was Qutub-ud-din Ahmed. His Father name was Abdul Rehman. He received the knowledge of Jurisprudence, Fiqh, Hadiths and Quran. He served as teacher for more than 20 years.

Hence, both reformer started the from Islamic teaching then spread the knowledge in sub-continent

Services of Sheikh Ahmad Sirhindī

- 1) Spread of Islamic teaching through his students

Sheikh Ahmad Sirhindī sent his student to different parts of subcontinent for spread of Islamic teaching. As at that time there were unislamic practices and people were away from Shariah.

2) Opposition to Polytheism and Atheism

Under the influence of Hindus, Muslims started associating object with God. However, Sheikh Ahmad shirazi raised voice against them.

3) Raised voice against Deen-i-Ilahi

During Akbar's reign there was the concept of Deen-i-Ilahi, which was completely against the teachings of Islam.

Services of Shah Waliullah

1) Translation of Holy Quran for better understanding

Shah Waliullah was the first who translated the Quran in Persian language. It helped people to better understand the teachings of Islam.

② End the Sectarian Divide

At that time there was the huge divide between Shias and Sunnis. In his *Qurat ul Ain*, he explained the similarities between two sects to end their differences.

3) Promotion of jihad

During the Shah Waliullah time there was the rise of Marathas and Sikhs. He put emphasis on the importance of jihad. It was necessary for the glory of Muslim to fight against evil forces.

4) Stresses on the Importance of Jihad

Introduction :

Currently, Pakistan is facing multiple challenges at social, economic, demographic and environmental challenges. Due to these challenging it impacting the overall growth of Pakistan.

In a book *Govern the Ungoverned* by Fazlur Hussain explained the all problems of Pakistan. These problems are not new to Pakistan but these exist from the very essence of Pakistan. Hence, there is the dire need to address these challenges.

Economic Challenges

1) Fiscal Deficit

According to World Bank

A country can ensure economic growth when its tax to revenue is 15% of GDP but in case of Pakistan tax to revenue is less than 11% which is alarming for Pakistan. As Pakistan is facing fiscal deficit or budget deficit for years due to widening gap between country's expenditure and revenue. Fiscal deficit a macroeconomic factor poses challenge to economy's situation.

2) Balance of Payment Crisis

Another macro-economic factor is Balance of Payment crisis as Pakistan has become import based economy. According to Pakistan Bureau of Statistics 30% exports imports are based on energy goods. Hence, this dependency on imports creates the challenge for Pakistan to maintain the foreign reserves of Pakistan.

3) Unemployment: According to IMF Pakistan

Inflation in 2023 had reached 29%. And According to ILO report in 2023 explained that there 5.6 million unemployed people are in Pakistan. Hence, unemployment further pushes the inflation up.

4) Dwindling Foreign Reserve and devaluation of currency

Due to fiscal deficit and balance of payment crisis is country CPI (Consumer Price Index) is hardly hit. Hence, these factors leads to inflation and inflation impacts the exchange rates. These things determine the supply demand of the currency. Lower demand for domestic rupee further devalued the country's currency which automatically effect the foreign reserves of the country.

Environmental challenges

1) Floods in Pakistan

According to Economic Survey of Pakistan 1/5 area of area of Pakistan was hit by flood and it has impacted the life of 33 million people. Hence, the environmental factors impacting the lives of people in Pakistan.

2) Environmental Impacts on Agriculture

Moreover, 30% to 40% of

Mangoes production reduced in Pakistan due to increase in temperature. Moreover, Economic Survey of Pakistan in 2022-23 Pakistan agriculture sector was hit by floods.

3) Smogs / Environmental Impacts on Humans

According to WHO six to seven millions death happens every year due to poor air quality. Pakistan is 182 on Air Quality Index. Moreover, Lahore

is among the most populated cities ~~around~~ of the world. As air quality reduce the life expectancy.

Demographic Challenges

1) Increasing Population

According to Bureau of Statistics Pakistan, Pakistan population has reached 241.6 million which itself is alarming for Pakistan. As country is already in economic turmoil.

2) High Fertility rate

According to UN reports average fertility rate in Pakistan is 4.4% which is lowest in Pakistan except the Afghanistan. It poses great threat to Pakistan.

3) Mortality rate

The mortality rate in Pakistan is 68 out of 1000 children died in the first year of life.

As it shows the dangerous situation of mortality rates.

4) Out of school children

According to reports there are 23.9 million out of children in Pakistan between the age of 05 and 16. As it impacts the future of Pakistan.

Impacts on Pakistan

How It

1) Low Human Development Index

All problems collectively contribute towards the low human capital development index in Pakistan which is already 40% in Pakistan.

2) Brain Drain

As due to economic, social and demographic challenges millions of youth in Pakistan left to abroad for better opportunities.

3) Surge in Inflation and unemployment

As above challenges exacerbate the inflation and create the unemployment in the country. As country is already facing inflation of 29% and 5.6 million people are unemployed.

④ Widen the Gap between Rich and people

It further widen the gap between rich & poor according to Karl Marx in his Work Communist Manifesto that Bourgeoisie control the proletariat. This widen gap creates the tension conflict society.

⑤ Rise in terrorism

The unequal division of resources, due to lack of resources or mismanagement of resources create surge the terrorism.

Sheri Baloch first female to involve PAK terrorist attack in Karachi was the consequence of unequal division.

(b) Threat to Nationalism

According to 18th Amendment Health, education and agriculture are the province subjects. However, unequal distribution of resources creates the rift and disparities among center and provinces.. which give rise to provincial nationalism.


Q#7) Absence of a regional-based approach between Pakistan and Afghanistan

5) Economic Turmoil


According to Karl Marx it is not ideology but the matters that divide the countries on any subject matter.
