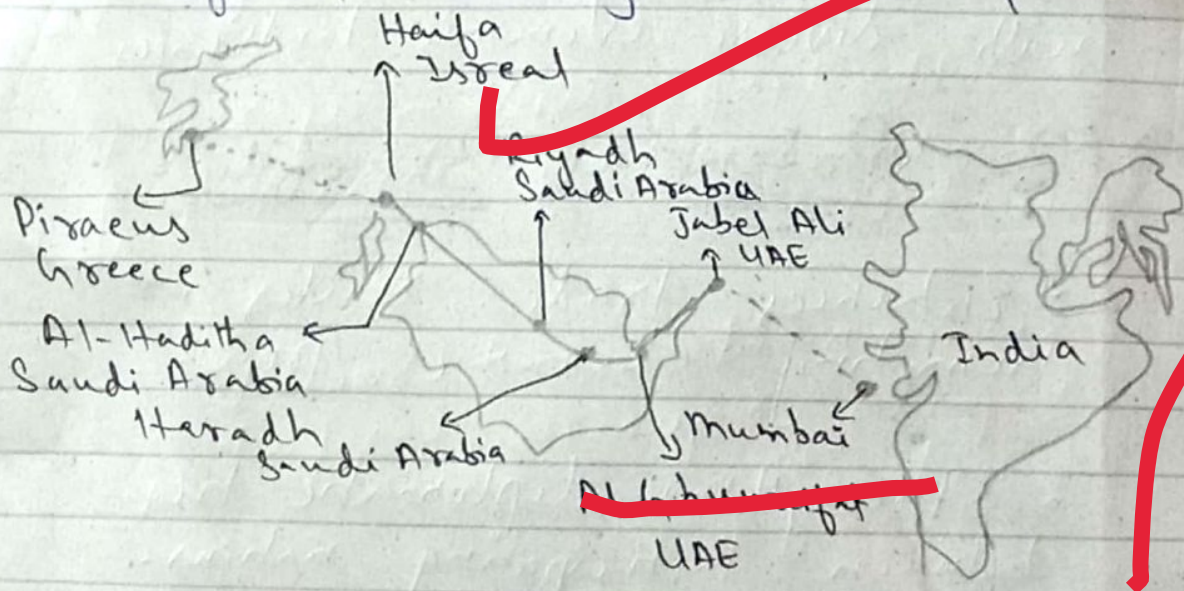

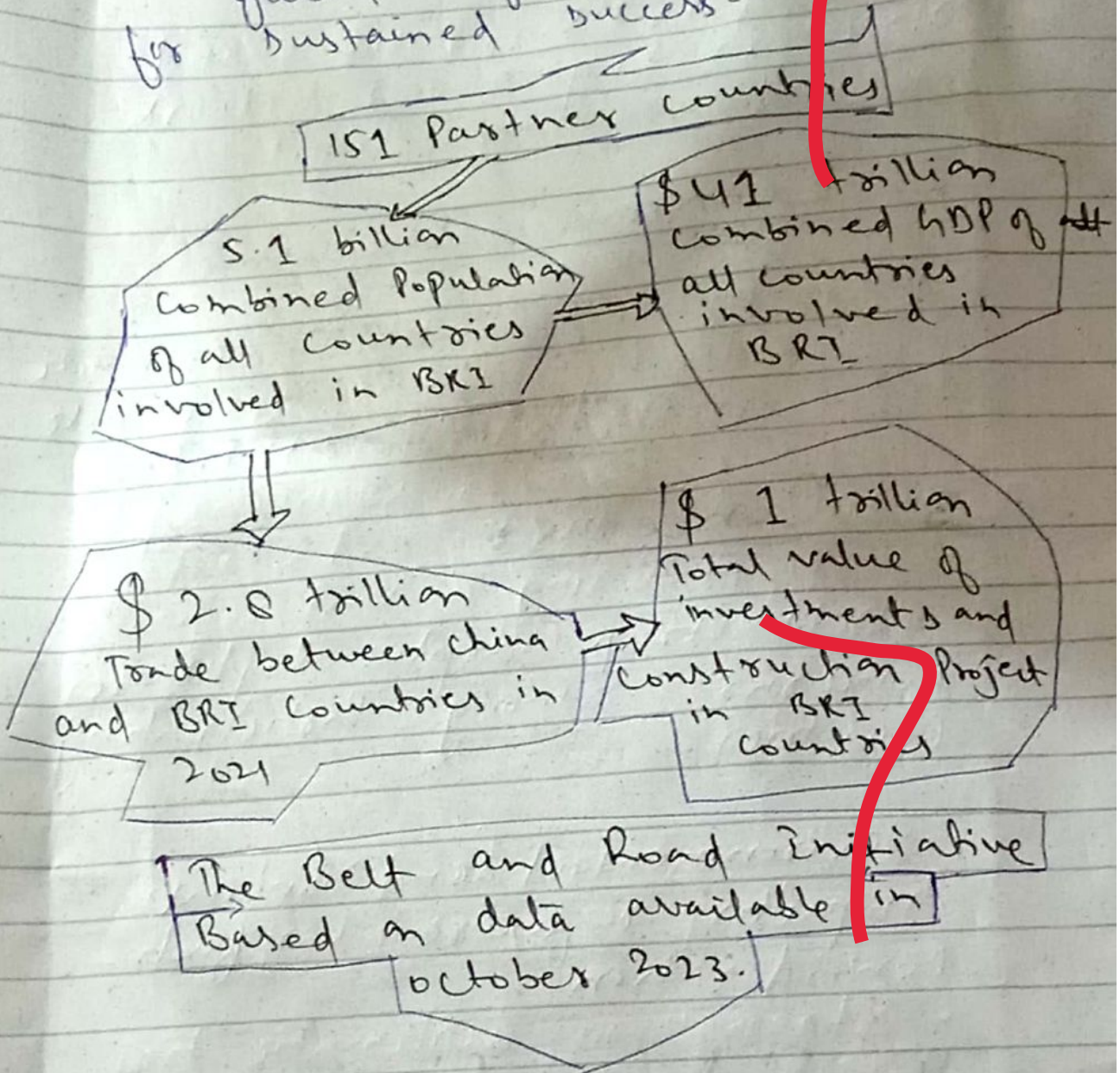

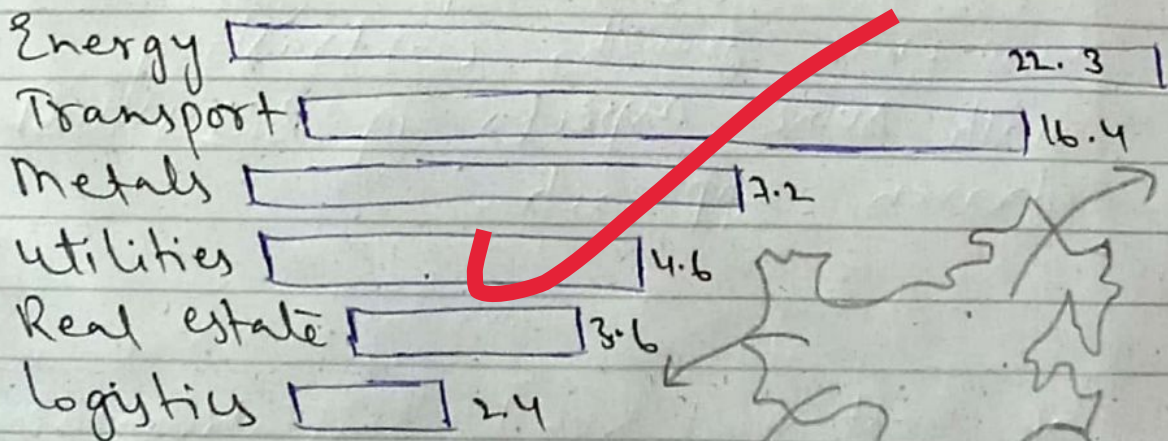

Total Chinese investment in the Belt and Road Initiative in 2021, by sector (in billion U.S. dollar)



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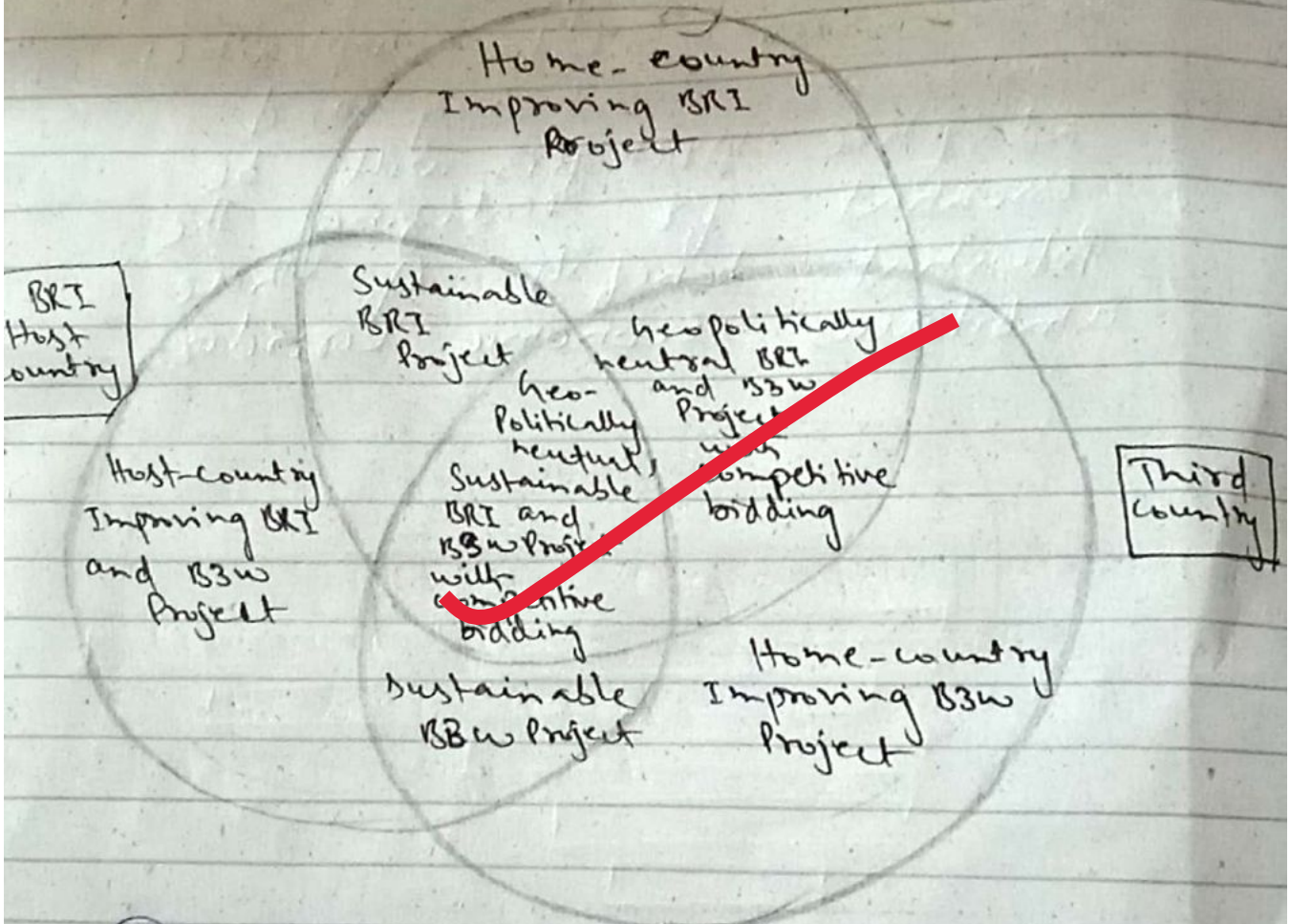

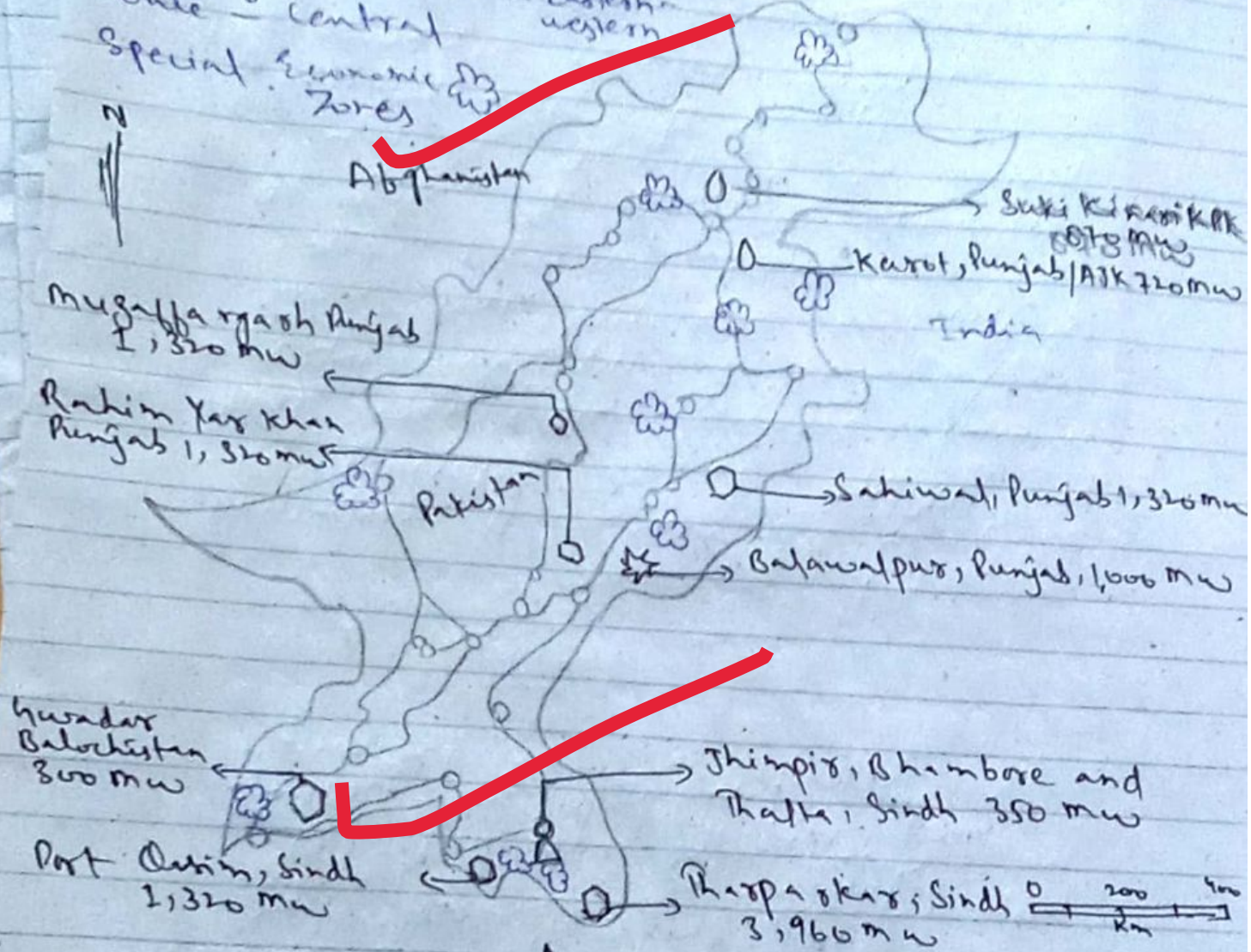

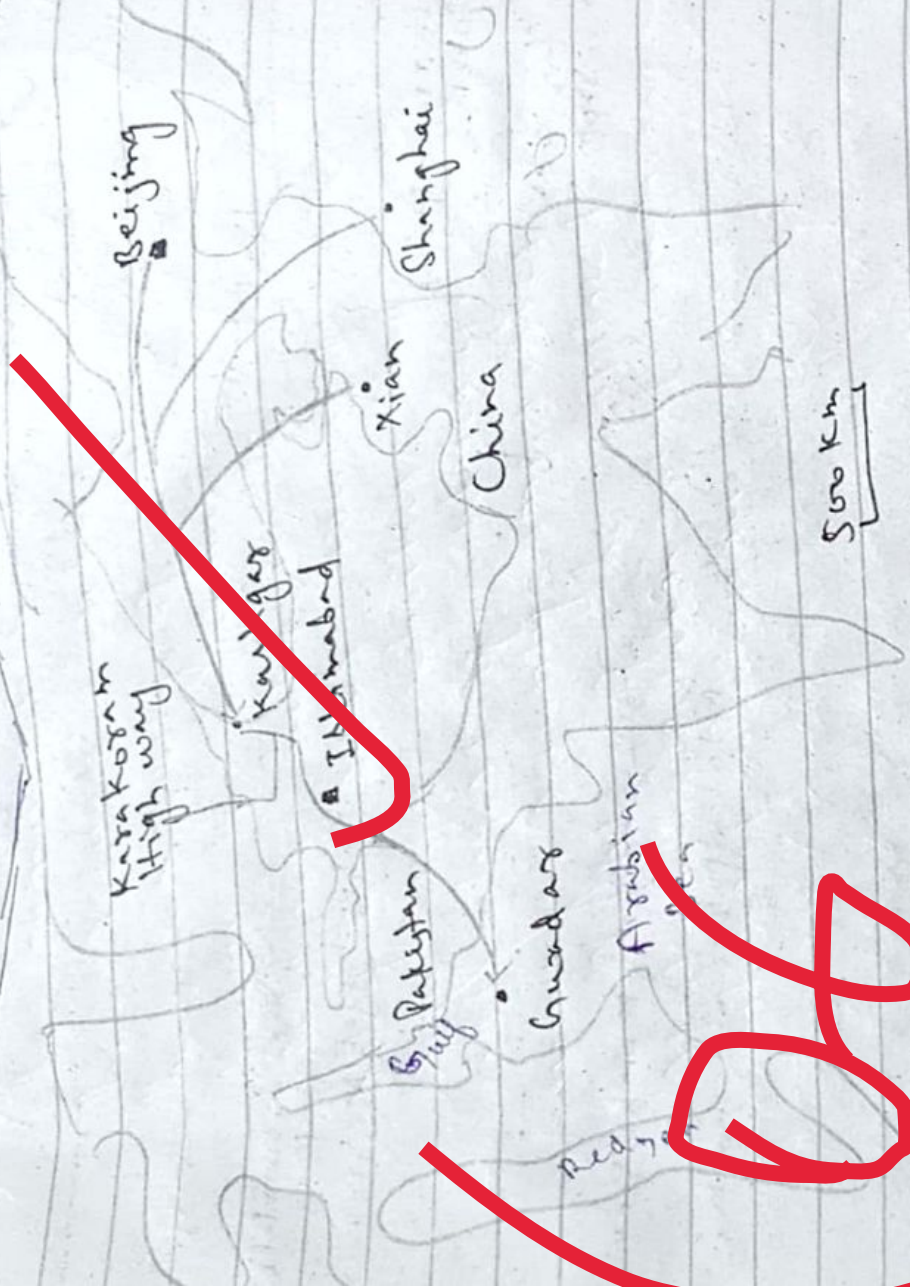
