Ans: 1I - Introduction

Deen is the complete code of life.

It comprises of the relationship between God and human being and also with the other human beings.

However, Din accommodates both the sacred and the worldly affairs. Ibn-e-Ichaldun has declared the importance of Deen by saying that Allah has introduced the Din for the protection of mankind. There are several differences between Deen and religion which will be mentioned in the answer.

Moreover, Deen has much significance in the life of human beings such as it gives guidance, provides criterion for right and wrong, encourages knowledge, promote social cohesion, gives purpose to the life and removes the anxiety of the life after death.

II What is Religion?

Religion is defined as the sacred relationship between man and God. It consists of rituals and dogmas. However, Deen is the complete code of life. There are two types of religion.

II a - Divine Religion / Semetic Religion

The religion that is of divine in origin are called the divine religion. The divine religion is only Islam.

II b - Non-Divine / Non-Sematic Religion

Non-Sematic religions are not divine in origin. They are man-made religions.


Example:

Buddhism and Hinduism are non-Semitic religions.


III - What is Deen?
