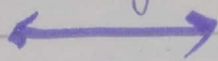
Title: Sovereignty of State vs International Law.

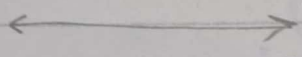

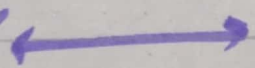

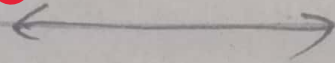
