1. DIFFERENCE BETWEEN RELIGION AND DEEN:-

The words "Deen" and "Religion" are often used interchangeably for a specific set of beliefs through which people navigate their lives. But both have a slight difference in their scope.

a. Religion:

The literal meaning of religion is path/road. While terminology refers to set of beliefs, customs and rituals which is part of an individual's life. The term religion defines a person's way of living and has a narrow scope than deen.

On the other hand, deen ^{is} ~~has~~ a broader concept which literally translates to a number of meanings like beliefs, religion or any thing through which God is worshiped, a person gauge their lives and the belief on the day of judgement. Terminologically deen refers to Islam, the code of life Allah Himself choose for mankind. It incorporates all the aspects of life and provides a set code to navigate them.

Whenever, Islam is mentioned in the Quran, Allah has used the word deen as it truly explains the spirit of Islam. Allah said in Quran:

"This day I have perfected your deen for you, completed my favour upon you, and have chosen Islam for you as your deen (Al-Maidah)

In Surah Aal-e-Imran, Allah has mentioned Islam as a true deen. Allah said,

"Surely the true deen in the sight of Allah is Islam (Aal-e-Imran-19)

Though, religion and deen are used interchangeably, but the word that can explain Islam in its true sense is infact "deen", which has been used by Allah Himself in the Quran. Deen (Islam) has a very important role in the lives of Muslims as it guides them in every sphere and help them become better Muslims and better human beings.

2. IMPORTANCE OF DEEN IN HUMAN LIFE

Humans need guidance to navigate their lives in the best manner and Islam provides a complete code of life. Islam is not limited to belief and custom rather it provides complete social, political, administrative, economic and judicial system to follow, so that they (humans) can be successful in both worlds. The purpose of our lives have been described by Quran in following manner:

(Al-Zariyat)

In Surah Baqrah Allah says:

"Quran was revealed as guidance for man-kind, as a clear signs that show the right way and distinguish between right and wrong"

(Al-Baqrah)

c. Provides all kinds of Systems-

Islam as a true and complete deen provides all kinds of systems for the humans to lead a upright and successful lives. It gives perfect judicial, administratives, social, economic and political system.

d. Spiritual Cure for All Times

The Islam is, has been and will be a source of spiritual & healing. Through following teachings of deen-e-Islam a person can get immense gratification and it will provide spiritual healing to the lost souls yearning for their creator's words. The recitation of Quran has been proven to be a healer for the soul and mind. Allah (SWT) mentioned in Quran, how it (Quran) is a healing and mercy for believers.

"And we reveal the Quran that which is healing and a mercy to the believers and it adds only to the perdition of unjust" (Al-Quran)

e. Source of Wisdom and Enlightenment

Allah mentions ^{it} in Surah An-Nisaa - "And Allah has revealed to you The Book and the wisdom, and He has taught you what you did not know, and Allah's grace on you is very great (An-Nisaa - 113)

Allah has provided the knowledge of universe in the Quran and only the ones who are keen enough to delve into the wisdom will understand and unravel the secrets.
