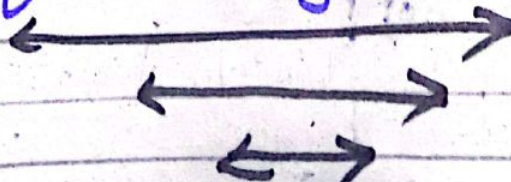
Nature and Legitimacy of International Law

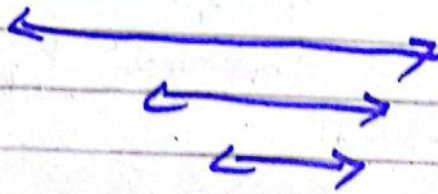
Q#02 How did Lincoln succeed in convincing the jury?

Q#031- How was Lincoln tactic 'non-malicious'? In view of the result, does it matter the tactic was malicious or not?

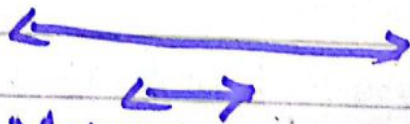
Answer- Lincoln tactic was non-malicious because he used to depend his case. The result was in favour of
