Albert Bandwa, in histheory suggested that much of learning takes place through observation, Children observe the actions of those around them and then immitate their behavior. He also revealed to in his well known experiment i.e Bobo doll experiment in which he revealed that how easily children couldbelet to immitate even negative actions. Children who watched a Video of an adult bealing up a large inflatable doll were likely to copy those actions when given a chance - Bandura studies showed that antisocial models (Jamily, neighbourhood and TV) may have antisocial effects. Coxe concepts of Social learning theory There are three core concepts at the heart of social learning theory Just is the idea that people can learn through observation. Next is the notion that internal mental states are essential part of this process - Junally this theory recognizes that just because something has been learned, it doem't mean, it will result in a change on behavior. According to hom to lowing steps are involved in the observational learning Motivation Retention + Reproduction Attention 1. Altention: In orderto learn, you need to be paying altention - Anything that distracts your attention is going to have a negative effect on

observational learning . If the model is interesting or there is a novel aspect of the situation then you are likely to dedicate you full altention to learning

- 2- Relention: It is the ability to store information. It can be affected by a number of factors, but the ability to pull up information later and act on it is vital to observational learning.
- 3- Reproduction: To perform the behavior that you observed If further leads to skill advancement.
- 4. Motivation: Récinfoccement and punishment play an important vole in motivation. You experience these motivators to be highly effective when you observe others experiencing some type of reinfoccement or punishment.

Impact on journalists: This misuse also extends to journalists, with reports suggesting that countries like Azerbaijam, Uzbekistam, and kazakstan have triggered assests in uksaine using these mechanisms.
