life.

Concept of Death as a

Gateway and not the End

In Islam death

is not the finality of life or an end to it. It is

a door toward another life. All muslim believe

that they will according to the will of

Allah on a designated time and when their

actual life will begin. As Allah mentions in

the Quran

"Every soul shall taste death"

Concept of Accountability

The concept of Akhira is strongly linked to accountability for one's actions and deeds that they commit during this life. Every single deed and action will be accounted for before the court of Allah. Those that lived a good life following the teaching of Islam will be rewarded while the wrongdoers will be punished for their crimes. As Allah says:

"It will have [the consequence of] what [good] it has gained and it will bear [the consequence] what [evil] it has earned"

The Current life as merely a trial:

The present life is merely a test for humans to prove themselves worthy of Heaven. Every single word, action and deed is being penned down to be present in the akhira. As it is mentioned in the

Quran "And we test you [O humanity] with good and evil as trial then to Us you will [all] be returned!"

Concept of Heaven and Hell

Islam present the concept of heaven and hell with Akhirah. One being the bet~~er~~ blessing for the pious and the other being the punishment for those that stray from God's designated path. All will have to give an account of their deeds and by Allah's command will either enter heaven or hell. It is mentioned in Quran that,

Rights of Women in Islam

Islam values women more than any other religion and civilization ever to exist. Islam gives equal rights to women as men and both are held equality accountable before Allah.

1 Right to Own Property

Islam gives right to women to own property in their own name. Allah mentions in Surah Nisa, "And do not wish for that by which Allah has made some for you exceed others. For men is a share of what they earned and for women is a share of what they have earned."

2. Right to Conduct Business

Women can also conduct business in their own name. This is seen by the example of Hazrat Khadija (R.A) who was the wife of Prophet PBUH. She was a business woman who excelled in business dealings and ventures.

3. Right to Acceptance in

Marriage: Allah gave women the right to choose spouse and present their acceptance at the time of marriage. Islam forbids forced marriages. The Holy Prophet (PBUH) when the commandment came from Allah to wed Fatima (RA) to Ali (RA) asked for his daughter's acceptance before marriage.

4. Right to Inheritance

Unlike the old times Islam gives women the right to inheritance and has many verses in Quran that talk about this very subject. Exact amounts of inheritance with respect to relations is mentioned in great detail in Quran.

5. Right to Divorce

Women in Islam have a right to divorce. When a woman obtains divorce it is called Khula. The concept of women having divorce was unheard of before the advent of Islam. Islam recognizes that divorces in some cases are necessary and hence women are given this right.

6. Right to Protection and Care

Women have a right to protection and care in Islam. Islam appoints caretakers/guardians for women. Before marriage this responsibility lies with the father and the is handed over to the husband. The Holy Prophet has commanded:

"I command you to be kind to women (Bukhari)"

7. Right to Life and Respect:

Women are given the right to life and respect unlike how the pagans used to bury their newborn daughters alive. The Holy Quran mentions,

"And We have certainly honored the children of Adam and carried them on the land and sea and provided for them of the good things and preferred them over much of what We have created with preference"

8. Right to take part in Political Activities

Islam gives right to women to take part in political activities as in the time of the Holy Prophet women used to be involved in planning of campaigns and other state matters. Even at the time of Kaliph Umar RA. A woman questioned him on something she perceived as inconsistent.

9. Right to Education

Women in Islam

have a specific right to education and the Holy prophet has outright mentioned.

"Seeking knowledge is mandatory for every Muslim"

As a Mother:

3 Ban on Muslims practicing Islam

In countries like ~~France~~ France public practice of Islamic modesty such as wearing burka and head scarf has been declared forbidden. A person doing so will be subject to violation of law. These policies are because of extremist nature of prejudice being harboured by the west.

4. Discrimination faced by Muslims
