c) Social Services

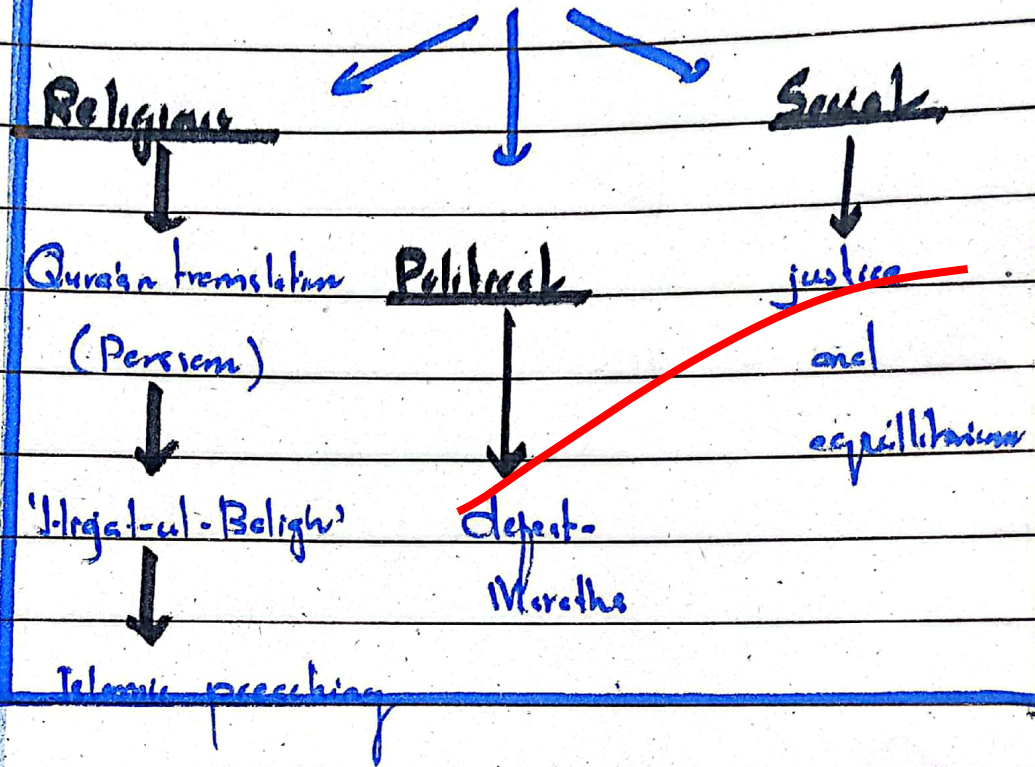
Furthermore, Shah Waliullah

(Allama M. Syed)

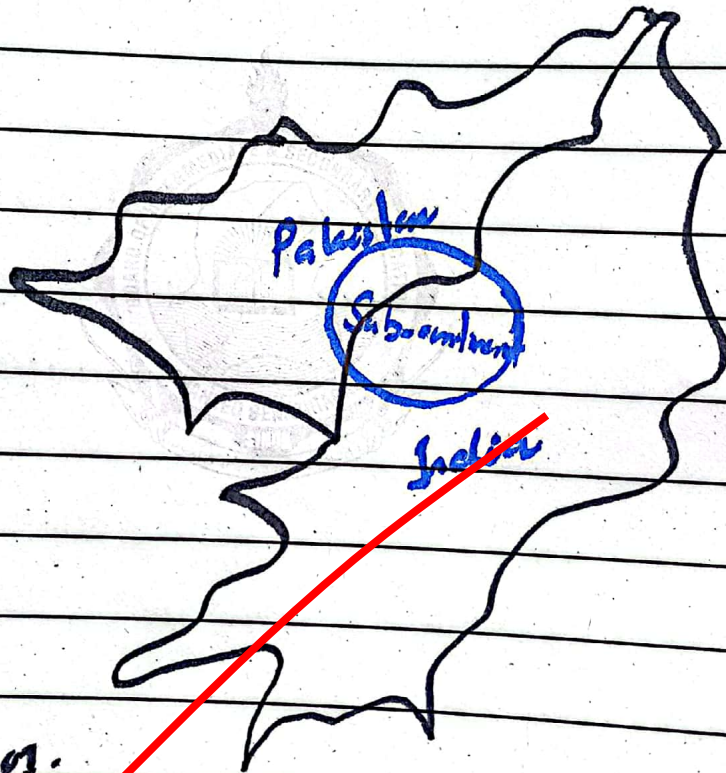

need of a separate homeland.

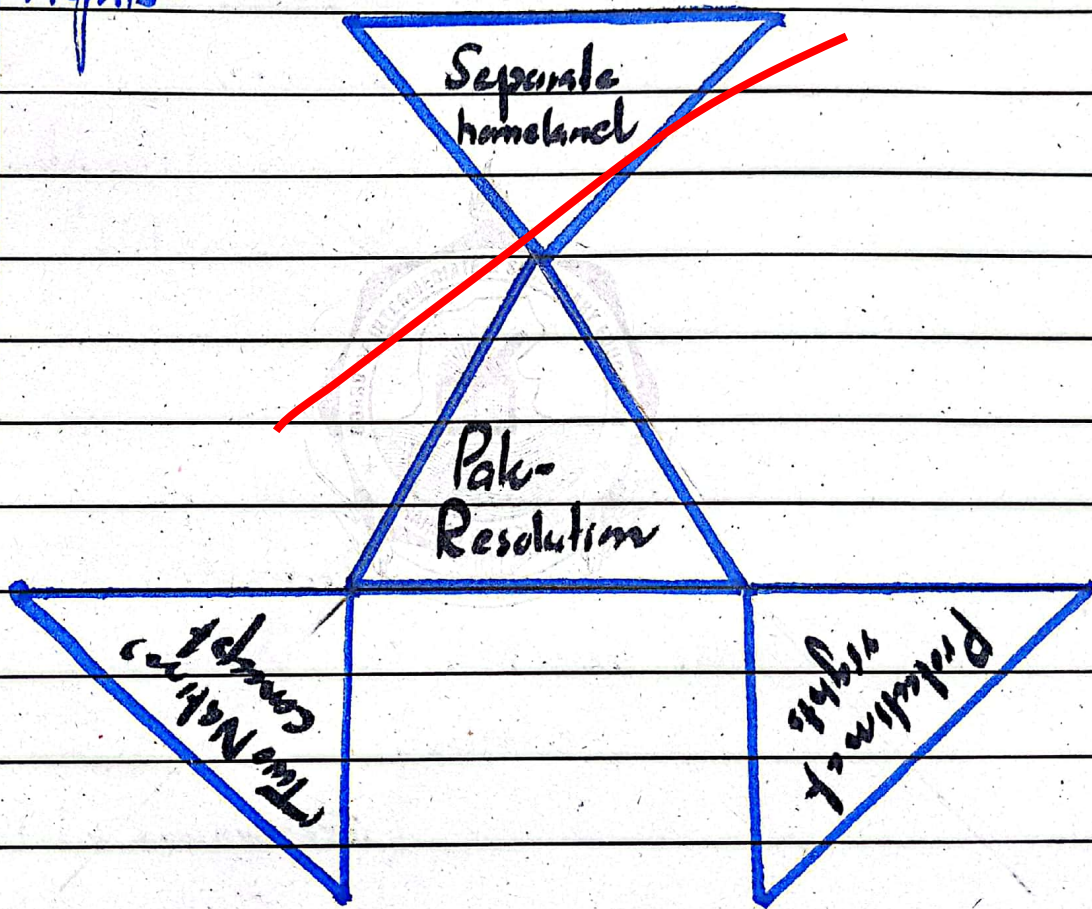
c) Protection of rights of Muslims

(Quaid-e-Azam, Muhammad Ali Jinnah)

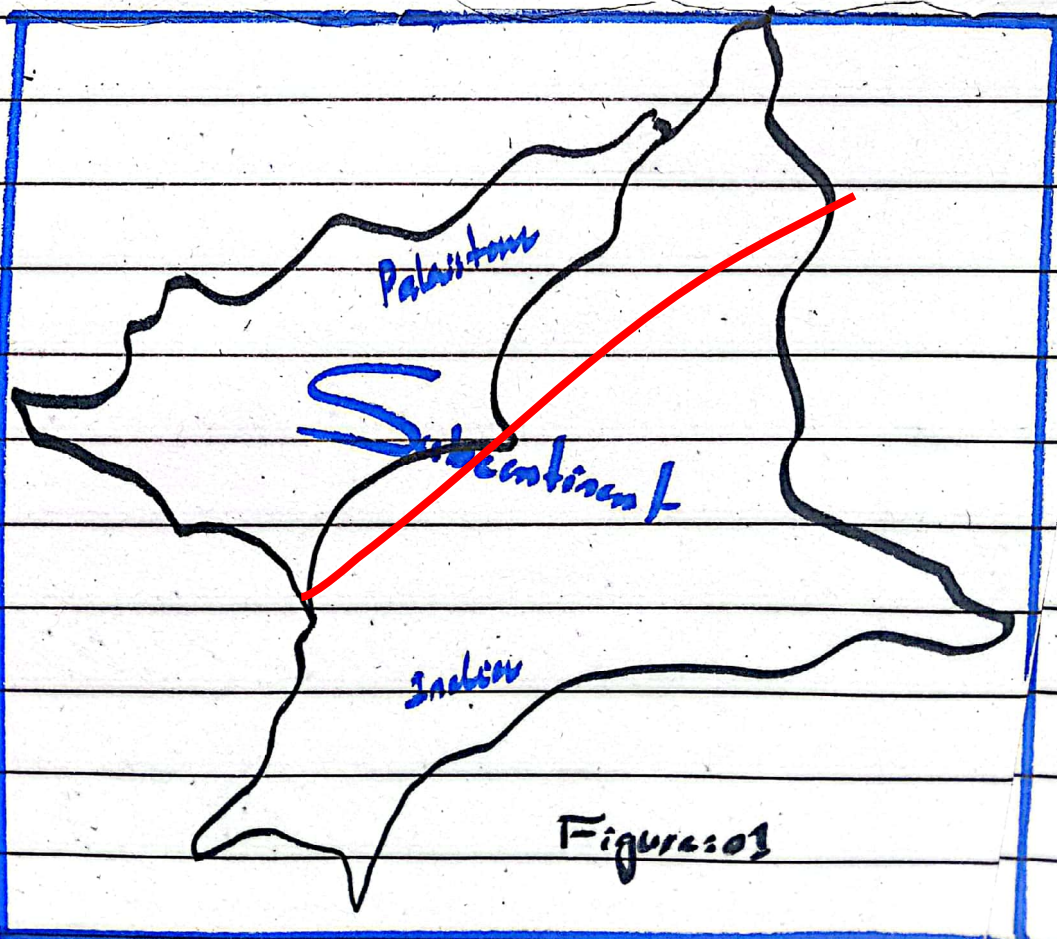

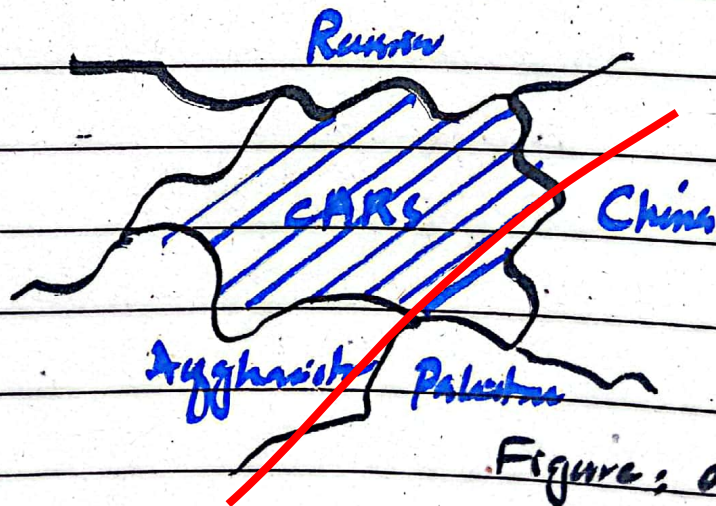

Thus, early child marriage is also contributing to population in Pakistan.

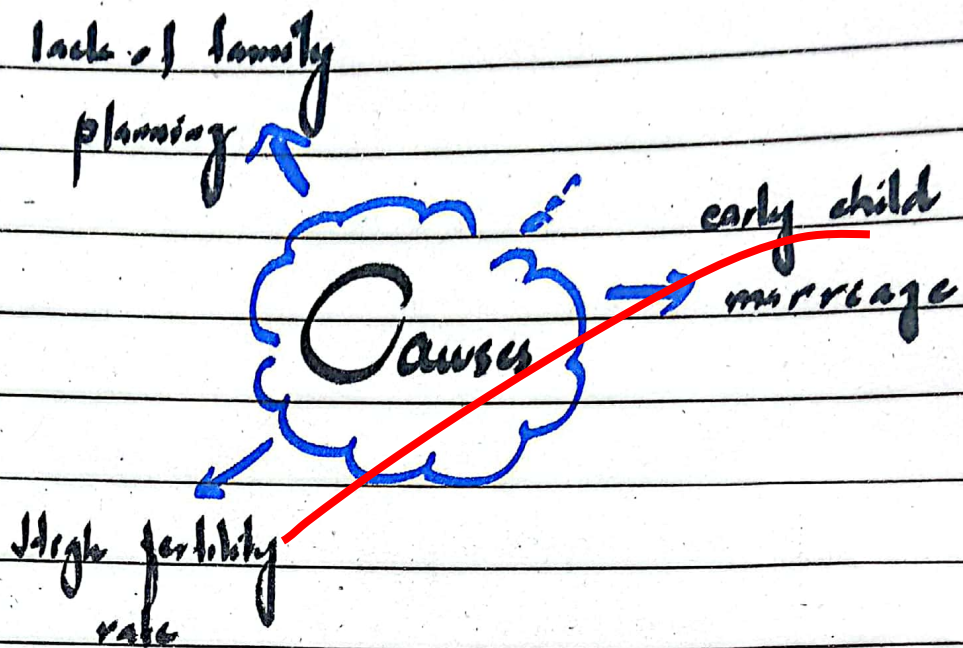
c) Lack of family planning

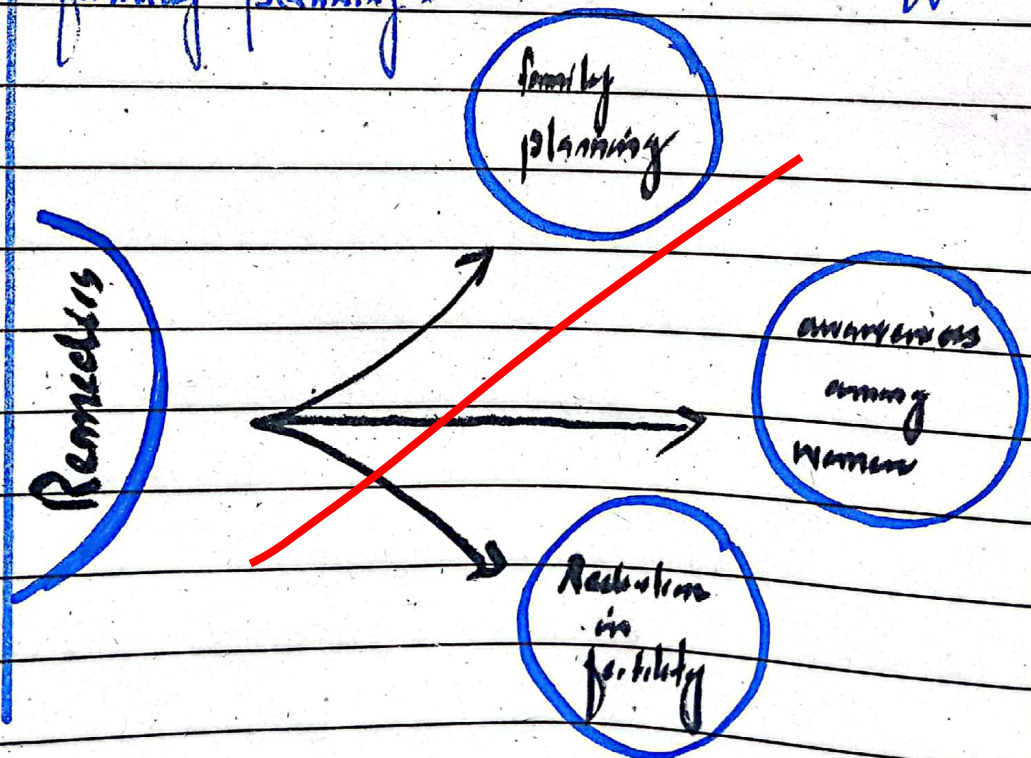
Frame Family planning policies
