2 Foundational Document: just as the Magna Carta laid the groundwork for constitutional principles, the Pakistan Resolution laid the foundation for the creation of Pakistan.

The Lahore Resolution played a crucial role in unifying various Muslim political, social, and religious groups under common goal for Muslims.
