1) Temporary World vs Everlasting World :-

This world is temporary. This world is a test of cultivate good faith and good deeds. The true and eternal world is the Akhirah. It is the permanent life.

The Quran remind us
"Know that the life of this world is merely an amusement and diversion, an adornment and boasting to one another, and competition in wealth and children. It is like rain which grows plants, then withers

them so you see them yellow, then they crumble away. But in the Hereafter is a great reward for those who fear Allah and a garden of Paradise) beneath which rivers flow (Quran 57:20).

2) The Day of Judgement

The Akhirah will start with Day of Judge (Yawm-al-Qiyamah) when the current world ends and Allah Almighty judges the all humanity on the basis of good deed and bad deeds. This day is called as "Day of Resurrection".

The Quran describe this day as "Day when every soul will come, driven by an angel urging it on" (Quran 50: 21)

3) Paradise and Hellfire

The day of judgement decides Paradise or Hellfire on the basis of deeds to a persons. Paradise is described as place of eternal bliss with lush garden, flowing river and unimaginable pleasures. It's a

reward for righteous living and obedience to Allah. On the other hand, Hellfire is a place of intense suffering and punishment for those who disbelieved or neglected their faith.

"But those who strive for the pleasure of Allah and are good and do good deeds - those shall be admitted to the Gardens, beneath which rivers flow, to abide therein forever. And that is the great reward"
Quran 3:15

4) Importance of the Akhrah :-

Belief in the Akhrah shapes Muslim ethics and priorities. It encourages patience in difficulty, promote good deeds and discourage chasing worldly pleasures at the expense of spirituality. It remind us that this life is not end that our actions have consequences and that true success lies in pleasing Allah and securing a place in Paradise.

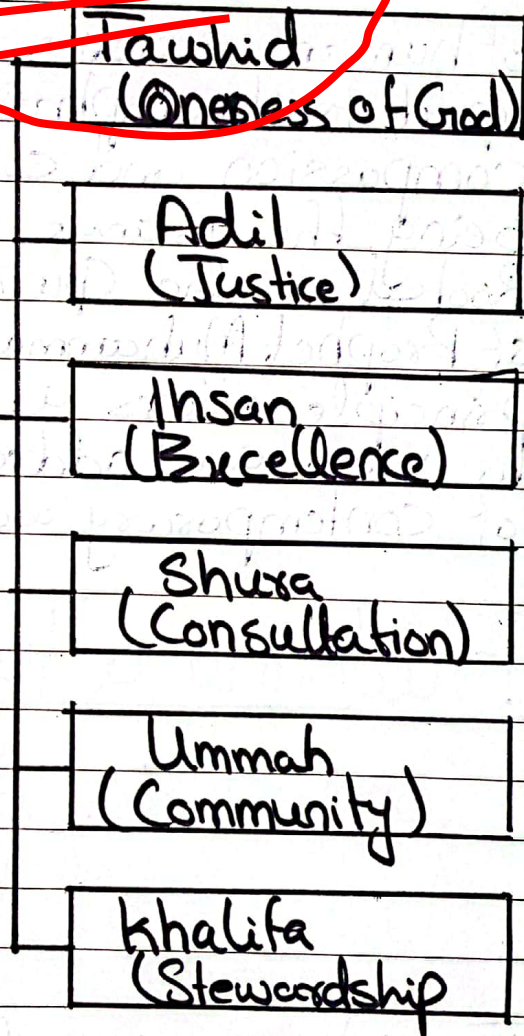

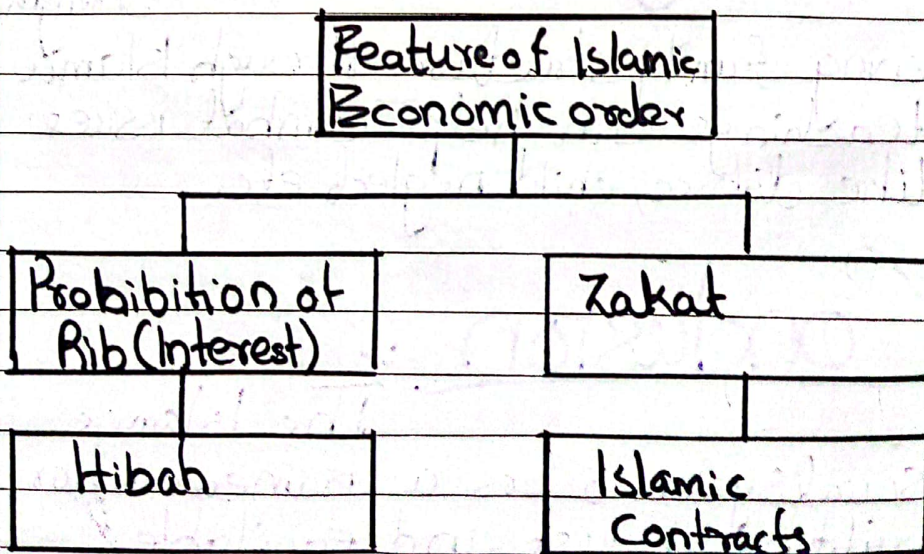
Question 7

2) Zakat (Obligatory Charity)

This annual wealth tax aims to redistribute wealth and alleviate poverty to promoting social solidarity and responsibility.

3) Hibah (Voluntary Charity)

Beyond Zakat, voluntary giving is highly encouraged to fostering a culture of compassion and generosity.

4) Islam Contracts

Specific contracts like Mudarabah (profit-sharing partnership) and Musharakah (joint venture) ensure fairness and transparency in business transactions.

Social Justice in Islam

Equality and Dignity for All
