① Literal Meaning:

Ijtihad is taken from Arabic word جَاهَدَ which means to strive

② Technical Meaning:

Ad scholarly definition of ijtihad is a struggle made by Mujtahid to find the solution of matter that is not found in Quran and Sunnah.

③ Concept of Ijtihad

Islam is both static and dynamic. There are several matters whose

④ Need of Ijtihad

Question arises: Why was there need of Ijtihad? The answer is simple. Islam is not a stagnant religion. It allows to use wisdom to find solution of matter not found in Quran and sunnah. The prophet S.A.W is reported to have asked Hazrat Maaz (R.A) when he was being

appointed Qazi (The judge of Yemen)

Hazrat Maaz replied;

"I will use to the best of my ability to find solution."

The prophet praised the companion on his reply.

⑤ conditions for Ijtihad

There are two conditions that must be fulfilled before ijtihad is conducted.

(i) Matter is not found in Quran and sunnah

It should be ensured that the matter that is legislated or for which Ijtihad is done is not

found in Quran and Sunnah.

(ii) It must be done by Mujtahid
Ijtihad must be done
by the Mujtahid.

Mujtahid is the
person who has the
following qualities.

Qualities of Mujtahid

(i) Knowledge of Quran and Sunnah
Mujtahid must have knowledge
of Quran and Sunnah. It enables
him to confirm matter is not found in them.

(ii) Command on Arabic language

Quran and Sunnah are
in Arabic language. So, Mujtahid
must have command over
Arabic language.

(iii) Contemporary knowledge

Mujtahid must also
have contemporary knowledge.
As it qualifies him to
be expert in that
field. Since, a doctor is
not qualified to treat

patients unless the law
reaches degree.
