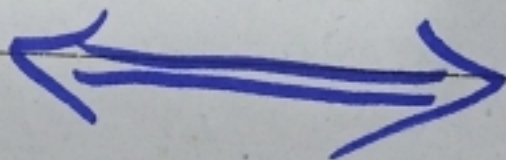
Question: 5
