The Global Democracy Index, 2023 reveals that the rate of democracy is declining globally; it has dropped from 5.29 in 2022 to 5.23 in 2023 (EIU, Democracy Index, ^{Feb} 2024). The same index shows that all third-world countries has shown bad performance, but worryingly, Pakistan has downgraded from a democracy to an authoritarian state. This index is a whistle blower for all developing countries and specifically for Pakistan. The transition from a democracy to an authoritarian regime changes the open-air state into a cage where people are not supposed to raise questions about the credibility of public policies. They are just obliged to follow them blindly, no matter if they get any benefit or not. This situation violates all the human rights enlisted in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.
