1) Factor determining role of courts in society

Multiple factors determine the role of courts in ~~facto~~ society such as perception of judges for their function, expectations of people, the legislative and the Executive. Moreover, the interplay between judiciary and other socio-political institutes also determines the role of courts.

2) Influence of changing conditions and conceptions on role of courts

Changing conditions and conceptions significantly influence the role of courts, as shifting public opinion and expectations lead to new approaches to certain issues or cases. This means that as social values, norms and challenges evolve the role of courts is expected to adapt accordingly.
