Support for the family, ~~his~~ his authority cannot be challenged. If this patriarchal setup includes inculcates authoritative ownership role in the males, which often leads to women's compromised situation. She can be denied educational right and confined within boundary of walls if the father commands so.

The second contributor to gender discrimination is economic disparity.

According to Gender Pay Gap Statistics, women still earn 16% less than men.

In the offices, business organizations and factories, women are employed as they do not much argue on their economic rights.

Even the famous actresses having a more comparatively significant role in movie or drama than men are paid less remuneration for their bigger roles, which they repeatedly resonates and speak up against. Furthermore, women become a victim to workplace harassment as evident in our society. Whether it is educational

by her Boss to which resulted in her mental trauma and etc. made her alcoholic. Such cases are multiple and they needs to be addressed anyhow.

Third important obstacle towards gender disparity is the presence of manifold Socio-cultural taboos etc in our Society.

Dowry system has been made a Compulsory Contributory factor to women marriages. Unless She fills the her so called new house with ^{abundant} treasures of of high esteemed values, She is not Considered worthy of respect. After that, She is assigned the task of home making and being a good home maker with specialized cooking skills. Similarly, killing a women in the name of Honour by male family members is a social taboo and regressive picture of our Society, still it is ~~portrayed~~ ^{deemed} as morally virtuous tasks of ~~violating~~ eliminating pollution out of their lives because of violations from Standard norms.

Less political representation both on national and international level is also contributing force in of escalating/worsening the gender gap. In the United Nations, there is minimum representation of women.

Similarly, in Pakistan there is scarce political participation of women. All + Majority of Political seats are occupied by males due to the perception of males as being good leaders and decision makers. This is because women is deprived of deciding making right from her home environment. Without getting the due opportunity, they cannot influence and contribute to country's prosperity.

lastly, deprivation in educational and basic health care facilities present a sorry picture of widening gender gap. A major contributing factor in female empowerment is the tool of education.

With education comes knowledge, and "Knowledge is power" as Francis Bacon used to say. However, women is deprived of this basic right. According to a survey,

All of girls get married before 18 years of age in Pakistan". A girl who wants to pursue higher education is trapped in early marriage, unfortunately causing/putting an end to her aspirations. ~~SE~~ A

more depressing image is explicit in the rural areas where high school girls are bound to marry early and bearing children which compells them to drop out of school. As per Statistical Report, 2 Million

more girls than boys are out of school". Hence all these hindrances obstructs natural progression towards increased gender equality.

Gender equality is not a steady phenomena, it's constantly but gradually heading Concept. If hindrances are multiple, possible course of action are also manifold for smooth transitional journey of gender equality and empowerment. The first of these indicators to ensure gender equality is to change the traditional setup of patriarchy. Thirdly, not only workplace harassment, many connected issues related to gender inequality needs to be addressed. This means ending domestic violence, rape cases, kidnapping, forced marriages, forced prostitution practices through strict check and balances. The Government needs to introduce effective remedial policies like strict compliance of law and order, early court hearings instead of delaying cases for years, strict regulatory ~~functions~~ and check on the Police officers to in time submission

of case studies. The recent news regarding father sexually abusing her own daughter is a severe women rights violation and concern of highest degree posing a mental trauma of not being protection even from father who is supposed to be the guardian of family. To add more, "6,624 cases of rape were reported in 2023, reflecting a 12% increase from the 5,890 cases reported in 2022." Only strict regulatory actions can stop this menace.

Another positive contributor towards successful gender empowerment journey is provided by education. By putting an end to teenage early marriages, women must be encouraged to pursue higher education. Positive support system should be provided by family and mentors informing women about importance of education specially in rural areas. While urban women have good access to social media awareness and university education, rural women/girls are at loss. Therefore, educational campaigns countywide should be introduced regarding the power of education. Once women get right to education, there self-awareness, self-confidence, decision making skills, leadership and management qualities ^{will be} effectively fostered.

Last but not the least, Sustainable development programs are already been under process bridging the gender gap & and transitioning to equality in society. Certain approaches like WID (Women in Development) and WAD (Women and Development) are working to guarantee women their due rights.
