the first pillar, it is very cru-

cial to have strong belief

in the unity of God. As

Allah clearly mentioned in

Quran that he will never

enter a Polytheist in Paradise.

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or Jannah. This indicates that he hates those who compromise in his unity. Tauheed has great impacts on human life as it makes it more conscious & accountable to Allah.

Meaning of Tauheed.

Tauheed means the oneness of Allah and to have belief in oneness of Allah. Without belief in the oneness of Allah no one is considered as enter in Islam. Since, it is the first pillar of Islam and Allah Himself describes in Quran (Sura Baqara) that there is no god but Allah.

“لَا إِلَهَ إِلَّا اللَّهُ”

(Al-Baqara)

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So this verse indicates that how important is tauheed. Besides, Allah says, "اللَّهُ خَالِقُ كُلِّ شَيْءٍ"
 "Allah is the creator of every thing"
 (Al-Zumar)

It has been very clear from the aforementioned verse that Allah has made all things & therefore, no one has right to become His partner in that.

Forms of Tauheed

There are 2 major forms of tauheed:

1) Oneness in Character:

Allah says that that He is alone in his oneness no one is his partner and relative. He loves those who believe in His oneness. He is the omnipotent and omnipresent and the owner of the whole world.

2) Oneness in Actions:

Allah is alone in his actions, as he made this world in 6 days. No one can do this and even no one can do anything without his will. Even though whatsoever he made in this world, is responsible for anything. As, he made no anything without reason as he mentioned in Quran that he created everything according to a measure. The Dignity of Women

in Islam:

Islam accord women great dignity as she is very important part of a Muslim family. Before Islam, she was treated like an animal, but Islam bestowed her great respect. Even, the Prophet Muhammad (P.B.U.H) in his last sermon clearly said that both have been born by Adam & Eve, so no one is superior except in piety.

Rights of Women

in Islam:

In addition to dignity, Islam bestowed women many rights. Some of them are as under;

1) Right to Education:

Islam granted her right of education as the prophet Muhammad (P.B.U.H) said, "Getting education is incumbent on male and female." He never mentioned alone man for getting knowledge. Even, he himself was teaching his wife Ayesha (R.A) & other women. Thus, Islam granted her to get education and be independent.

2) Right to Marriage:

She has the right to choose spouse for herself and she has been

allowed by Islam to give her
 consent in any proposal.
 As there is hadith, "Ask her
 consent if she is silent then
 her silence is her assent"
 "Al Bhukhari"

3) Right to Divorce a Man:

Similarly, she has
 been given the right to
 divorce a man and end
 an unsuccessful marriage.
 Since, she has been given to
 marry again after divorce
 of "Khula". The Prophet (P.B.
 U.H) himself married with
 widows and divorcees.

4) Political Rights of Women:

She has been gra-
 nted political rights by Isl-
 am under the Islamic
 injunctions. During the prophet

(P.B.U.H) females were asked about politics and wars were fought by them. She has been granted right to rule a country under Islamic injunctions, even though, Hazrat Ayesha (R.A) was ruling in Arab after ^{the death} prophet (P.B.U.H)

5) Her Economic Rights:

She has the right to have property and she can lease or sell her property. Even after marriage she is granted the Mahar which is making her economically strong and independent. She has half right in the inheritance's property. As Dr. Hameedullah in his Book "Introduction to Islam", says that she has been given

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all the powerful rights in Islam.

Analysis:

It has been noted that Islam granted her many right and dignity. Unfortunately, her dignity is compromised in many Muslim States even in Pakistan. She has been victim of violence and honor killing.
