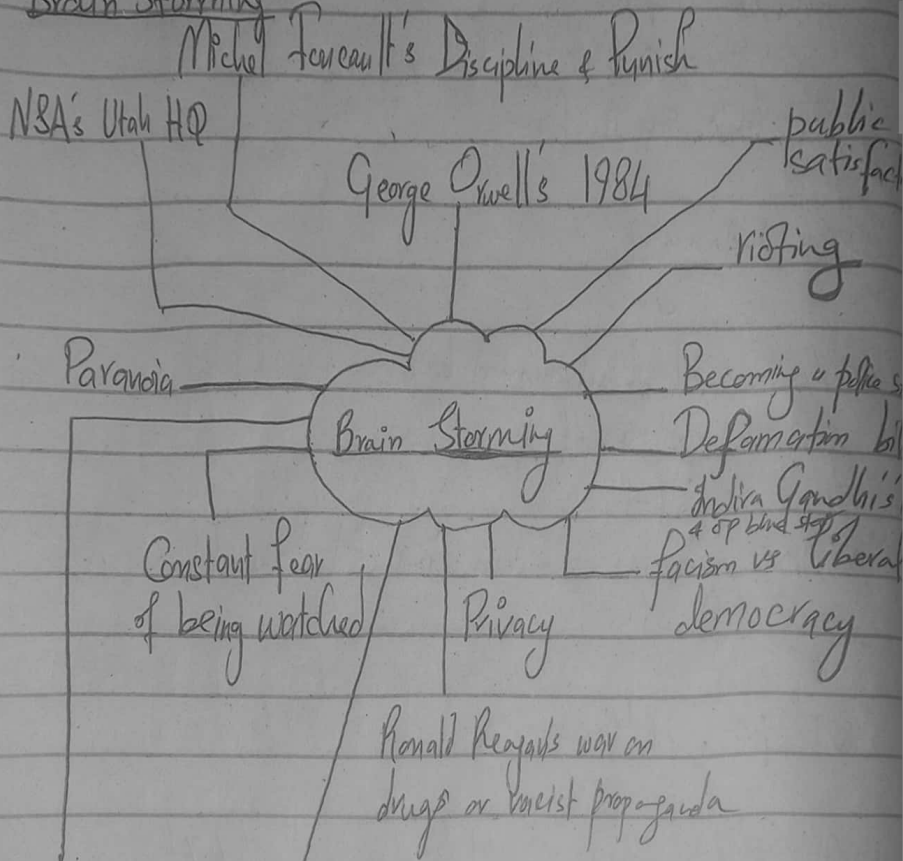

## The Essay

"Big brother is watching you!" an often quoted phrase from George Orwell's notorious novel 1984 shows how traumatizing and Government Surveillance can be. Orwell wrote of a fascist state that kept a watchful eye on its citizens and of the madness that ensued in the dystopian nightmare.

The omnipresent eye of the governments, is for the protection of the people or for the protection of the interests of the statesmen. Are the people comfortable with being watched and will it not lead to a constant state of mental unrest among the masses.

"Spectacle of the scaffold" is the name of the chapter of Michel Foucault's "Discipline and Punish". The chapter discusses how the terrible sight of public execution ~~were~~ served the purpose of deterring the masses. The torture techniques, in a way, symbolized the graphic descriptions of infernal torment mentioned in Biblical scriptures. Thus showing the people that no one would be safe if they picked a fight against the sovereign hegemony. Furthermore, Michel Foucault writes of the "Panopticon" in the chapters that follow. The "panopticon" is a watch tower situated within the prison and its presence within the prison is to show that the prisoners are being watched. Foucault then goes on to compare the prison system with the state and elaborates on how constant surveillance exists to keep the people in check, keep the deterrred and to keep the rulers safe and protect. Even though government surveillance is considered necessary for keeping criminal

activity in check it must also be noted that the omnipresence of the police further lead to paranoia, fear and hatred against the rulers. India centralized over India with an iron fist and was under influence for the forced disappearances of civilians, which she considered a threat to her government and her existence. Prime minister Zulfikar Ali Bhutto's Federal Security Force enforced Bhutto's ideology on the state by terrorizing the masses, and further led to his fall in popularity. Hence it can be concluded that the omnipresence of the government is not only serves to protect the state and its people but also to deter the public so that they don't become a threat to the existence of the bearer of the crown.

In the United States of America's National Security Agency had its base constructed in Utah and has access to records of all the existing people in the world in order to keep "democracy" safe. Predating the existence of the Utah base, it must be noted that the constant surveillance of ~~the~~ the people by FBI has led to the birth far left radical groups that have opposed their invasion of privacy.

Huey P. Newton's Black Panther Party existed for protecting the rights of Afro-Americans they were also threatened by the invasion of their privacy and the planting of false evidence by the police. During NSA's tyranny, groups like the "Anti-fa" (Antifascists) have emerged because the modern too fears the emergence of a dystopian state. Furthermore they have employed the same tactics as their rivals and use cyber warfare against their enemies as well.
