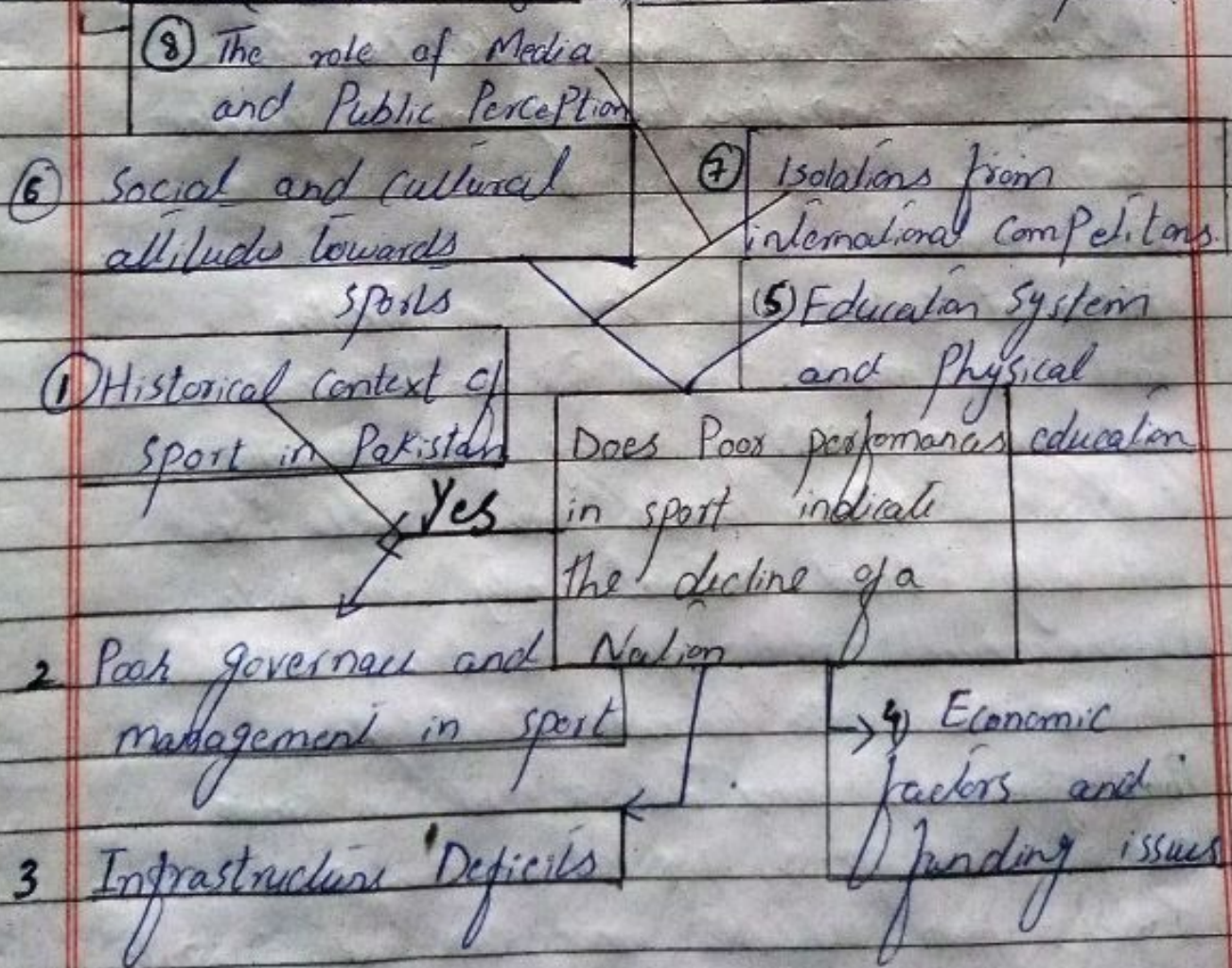

"THE ESSAY"

Sports have historically been a source of nation pride, embodying the spirit, resilience, and competitive nature of a nation.

"In the heart of every nation lies a passion that unites its people - the thrill of sports. Yet, as the roar of fans fades and

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medals collect dust. For Pakistan, a country that once held the world gaze with its hockey and cricket champions, the decline in sports performance serves as a glaring reflection of deeper societal issues. As the nation grapples with corruption, mismanagement and economic instability, the state of its sports not only mirrors these challenges but also raises a profound question: is a nation's decline measure not just in economic indicators but in the heartbeat of its athletes? Poor performances in sports is indicative of broader national decline as evidenced by Pakistan's challenges in sports governance, economic instability, and societal neglect, infrastructure and investment, education system and physical education, and the role of media. These issues highlight systemic problems that affect not only sports but also overall development and unity of the nation.

First come the historical context of sports in Pakistan past achievements golden era. Pakistan field hockey team was a dominant force in last 20th century winning three olympic gold medals and numerous world cup. figures like Hassan Sardar and Shahbaz Ahmed became household names contributing to a national identity centered around hockey. Pakistan cricket team

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claimed its first world cup in 1992 under the captaincy of Imran Khan, uniting the nation and elevating cricket to national obsession. Sports particularly hockey and cricket, have served a vital elements of Pakistan national identity creating a sense of pride and unity. The once-proud national hockey team has struggled to maintain its competitive edge, failing to qualify for a olympics in recent years, reflecting mismanagement and lack of support. The cricket team, while still competitive has faced inconsistency and controversies impeding its reputation on the international stage.

Apart from decline poor governance and management in sports is the main cause decline. In Pakistan sports federations such as Hockey federation and Cricket board have often influenced by political appointments rather than merit-based leadership.

political interference has compromised the autonomy of sports bodies, leading to mismanagement and inefficiency. Example The Pakistan hockey federation has frequently been criticized for appointing politically connected individuals who lack expertise in sports management. This has led to internal conflicts and deteriorating performance on the global stage with corruption comes the failure to adopt merit-based selection process.

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Athletes are often chosen based on nepotism, favoritism or political connections, undermining talent development. Example in sport like football and hockey, allegations of biased selection processes have emerged, sidelining deserving players and demoralizing emerging talents. Several reports on the Pakistan Sports Board (PSB) highlight ~~the~~ the lack of proper financial oversight and transparency in utilization of government grants. The PCB has witnessed multiple chairmen in a short span of time, ~~so~~ resulting in unstable cricketing policies and inconsistent strategies for domestic and international.

Beside poor governance come to infrastructure deficits is also a cause of ^{sport} decline of a nation. Pakistan has seen a significant decline in the availability of modern training facilities necessary for athletes to compete at international levels. Many training centers are outdated, lacking essential equipment and resources. Example in sports like athletics and swimming, athletes often train in subpar conditions, using outdated equipment that hinders their performance and preparation for competitions. Many sports stadiums and venues are in disrepair or have been neglected, limiting the capacity to host domestic and international events. The lack of proper venues not only affects athlete performance but

also discourage public engagement and attendance. Examples stadiums such as the Gaddafi stadium in Lahore, once a symbol of cricketering glory have faced criticism for inadequate facilities and maintenance, impacting the spectator experience and overall sporting environment. The absence of comprehensive youth sports programs hampers the development of the next generation of athletes without targeted initiative to engage youth in sports, potential talent goes unnoticed and untrained. Example the Pakistan sports board has not effectively promoted youth leagues in various sports, resulting in a lack of competitive opportunities for young athletes. Coaches often have limited access to workshops and training, which affects their ability to provide modern coaching techniques and strategies to their athletes.
