1- The passage describes that human beings' fear of death is similar to the children's fear of darkness. Since fears of both are amplified by the stories they hear. 4 - Seneca, the Roman philosopher, is of the view that the fear people have about the death is more related to the circumstances surrounding it - like rituals, groaning, <sup>of a</sup> dying man, and the mourning of his relatives - than the death itself.

5 - Several things contribute to making death seem more horrible than it is, as described in the passage - the groans of a dying person, the convulsions of the body, the pale and bloodless face, the weeping of friends, the mourning clothes worn by relatives and various death rituals. These elements add to the fear of death.
