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① There is no difference between human beings' fear of death and children's fear of darkness. Human The fear of darkness of kids increased by the stories of the heard ghosts and thieves. Similarly, the fear of human being is increased by the stories which they heard about the pain and condition of a dying man.

② Religious and scared view of death is when a human being regards death as a kind of punishment for his bad deeds which he has committed in this world. Similarly, if a person looks upon death as a means of making an entry into another world, he is definitely taking a religious and scared view of death.

③ Painful experiences described by Monks in their books are some kinds of physical torture and pain which they gave themselves to achieve a level of self-purification. This kind of thoughts and books increase the fear of a common man regarding death and its indescribable pain.

④ Seneca views about death are that the ceremonies and situation of death frighten people more than death itself would do. A painful sound; shaking body; pale face; and various rituals which are performed make death appear more terrifying than it would be actually.

⑤ The facts that make death appears more horrible than it would be otherwise are diverse ranging from uttering groans of dying man; his body undergoing convulsions; his face appears to be like bloodless; weeping of his friends and family and wearing of mourning clothes of his relatives.
