Third come the intellectual's role as philanthropist. Philanthropist plays a crucial role to make society better. First of all philanthropist like Bill Gates and Melinda Bill Gates, through primarily businessman, works on global health, education, and poverty using modern techniques. Secondly, Dr Ruth Pfau, a German nun contributed in the field of medical through her intellectual and hardworking practices. She dedicated her life to eradicate leprosy in Pakistan and made leprosy free Pakistan. Thirdly, famous philanthropist in Pakistan, Abdul Sattar Edhi, a richest poor man dedicated his life for poor and needy people of Pakistan. He made world's largest ambulance service in Pakistan. He promote

humanity amongst humans. His famous saying is

"People have become educated but have not become human."

Lastly, Mother Teresa, dedicated her life for the poor people in Calcutta. She is founder of Missionaries of charity. She also won the Nobel peace prize for her intellectual working for poor people. That's how intellectual philanthropist shape the society by their working.
