Introduction:

Pakistan has been facing multiple and serious challenges like political instability, constitutional crises, security threats, unprecedented crisis etc. One of the serious crises faced by the country is energy crises where state not only faced inadequate amount of local shedding but also the mounting prices of electricity bills. The energy crises badly impacted industries, agriculture sector, domestic life and public life. There is a need of tackle these ^{crises} ~~crises~~ at earliest in order to overcome the ~~imp~~ negative implications on National life.

2- Reasons for Expensive electricity in Pakistan.

a- Generating electricity through Hydrocarbons:

Pakistan generates almost 60% of energy through hydrocarbons. 12000 MW energy is produced by Diesel, 1000 MW through LNG, around 6500 MW through Coal. All these hydrocarbons are imported. Diesel is the most expensive one, LNG is 2nd most expensive and coal is the third expensive hydrocarbon. The price of HCs jumped up in the international market after the war in Ukraine and sanctions on Russia. In 2021, if 1 billion dollar oil is imported, it had a cost of 178 billion PKR and today it has 275 billion PKR.

b- Expensive Agreement with IPPs:

IPPs produce electricity through hydrocarbons. In 1994 and 2005 IPPs were installed

paid local IPPs in dollars which results in decline of dollar reserves

3- Problem with Electricity distribution and transmission system.

The total loss in transmission system is approximately 33%. Out of which, 17% of electricity is being lost by transmission lines. This is because majority of transmission lines are being expired. Resultantly, the line lost in Pakistan is highest in Asia which is 17%. The line lost in China is 3%, 9% in India and Bangladesh and 12% in Afghanistan. So out of 100 MW production, 17% being lost in transmission lines. This lost expense is borne by state and consumers. Another reason that there are numerous problems in distribution system that result in 16% loss of electricity. One of the reasons of increase in prices of electricity is electricity theft. Pakistan is on top of list. This theft is done

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is less and demand is more. While in 2011 and 2014, IPPs were installed to minimize dependency on oil and shift to LNG.

The more the increase in demand, the more the IPPs were installed. First and the major reason of expensive electricity is the capacity payments to IPPs. The IPP's payment agreement were signed on the basis of maximum demand. In Summer the demand is maximum as in July 2023 it is almost 28000 MW but in winter it reduces to 450% as in January 2023 it is about 14000 MW.

The government has to purchase the capacity in maximum.

If the government will not purchase ^{maximum} as in winter ~~the~~ the requirement is less, yet again government has to pay 33% to 40% of total payment. Another reason for the increasing prices of electricity is that IPP's were paid in dollars and the local IPP's were paid in rupees. But unfortunately, we have

done through kunda system and temper the meter reading. In rural H is agriculturist who use to theft and in urban centre industrialist and builder used to theft electricity. Also in tribal area, there is no system of paying bills and free subsidies in certain departments in Pakistan which result in 16% loss.

4- Implications:

a) Industry is on the worst hit:

The price of product is decided on the basis of purchase of raw material, transportation cost, labor rates and electricity cost. On the one hand, the state has not ensured non-stop supply of electricity and on the other the price of electricity mounted three times. Resultantly the price of industrial products also hiked. The products of Pakistan not competeable in international market as of India and

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Bangladesh which results in decline of exports of specially textile, leather sports etc. Industries are on the worst hit. Almost 200 industries are being closed in Pakistan in last 3 years. Multiple factors are responsible for this, but rise in electricity prices is the major reason.

b- Agriculture Sector:

More than 30% of agriculture is based on tubewells and digwells. These tubewells are powered by electricity. The more the load shedding, the more set back of agriculture. The price of agricultural products rises with the increase in electricity prices.

c- Domestic Life:

Most of the part of income in a middle class house is spent on electricity bills. This increase in prices of electricity tremendously disturbed the budget of domestic households. Also the

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has disturbed the domestic life

d- Public life:

The loadshedding caused the deindustrialization which results in increase in unemployment. The increase in price of commercial band the shopkeepers to add cost on the products. On one hand it decline the people purchasing rate and on the other the earning of businessmen is curtailed. Hence, increasing loadshedding and expensive electricity have far reaching negative impacts on National life.

Way Forward:

1- Renegotiate the agreements of IPPs:

The agreement negotiated signed in 1986, 1991, 1994, 2002 and 2005 should have been renegotiated long time ago but decades long delay was made by successive governments. Until 2020, when agreement were renegotiated, no capacity

Payments. It was a positive development and it had solved the problem maximum to 40%. The local IPPs ~~was~~ should paid in PKR. The agreement signed in 2011 and 2014 cannot be negotiated until 2028.

2b- Install local and cheaper electricity Projects.

Elec Energy policy of 2030, focuses on indigeneration of electricity. 15000 MW of electricity would be produced from hydel projects in which diam basha produce 4500 MW by 2029 and Dasm would yield 4300 MW by 2027 etc. Secondly increasing focus on electricity generation from coal of Ther, as one project of 1320 MW. Also production of electricity through turbines and solar projects. The objective of Pakistan is zero dependency on hydrocarbons import for electricity by 2030.

3- Updated transmission lines:

Country is in dire need to change the expired transmission lines in order to reduce the line loss of electricity.

4- Stop Electricity Theft:

The writ of state must be improved in order to stop electricity theft. Also the state must ensure not to provide free units to any department in Pakistan.

5- Privatization of Electricity System.

The electricity system should be privatized and the government just play the role of regulator.

Conclusion.

In a nutshell, increasing electricity prices has become a severe issue and it has impacted many sectors like industry, agriculture, domestic, commercial and public.

3- Reason of War

In 1948, Israel announced
state of Israel on the
land of Palestine. That sparked
resistance from Arab world but
the ~~west~~ big powers supported
Israel. The UN was formed to
bring peace in the world.
But it cannot solve the
Palestinian issue. Even P. Israel
was the participant of United
Nations but Palestine is not
its participant. On October 7,
2023 Hamas a military
and political organization launched
a surprise attack on Israel
which results in genocide
actions by Israel on Gaza.
The Arab world failed to
protect Palestine from war
crime by Israel.

War Crime Committed by Israel:

- a) State launched terrorism against Gaza

Israel has destroyed the northern and southern Gaza. Almost 90% of the buildings were demolished in this criminal bombardment. All the hospitals were destroyed. Almost all mosques and two churches are destroyed. Hospital, mosques, churches, universities nothing would be forsaken.

- b) Human tragedy in Gaza:

More than 37,000 Palestinians have lost their lives including women, children, doctors, healthworkers. Social workers, journalists etc. More than 10,000 were injured. More than 1.7 million people were displaced from Gaza. The refugee camps were also under the attack.

- c) Israel stop Food and medicine Supply:
Israel has stopped the supply of food, medicine

and other necessary items in Gaza. It even destroyed the electricity supply and water resources. Only limited supply of water, food and medicine is allowed in southern part of Gaza by Israel.

d) ICJ decision on War Crimes.

South Africa is on the lead to raise the voice against Palestinian killings. He filed case against Israel in International Court of Justice. All the Arab and muslim world countries favoured him in this case. But governments in Europe, US and Canada imposed this idea. ICJ demanded to Israel to stop these war crimes and also demanding their respective governments to stop supporting Israel.

Conclusion:

To sum up, ICJ demanded Israel to stop this genocide but Israel

claimed it was not abided
 by any rule. US facing
 students campaign against
 war crimes in favour of
 Palestine. Majority of countries
 favoured Palestine like Iran
 which attacked on Israel

 Pakistan and UAE condemned
 Israel for the war crimes.
