This sparked the Montgomery Bus boycott led by Dr Martin Luther King Junior. The protests and boycott lasted over years by black community in solidarity with Miss Rosa Parks. Ultimately, the USA's Supreme Court ruled that the segregation on public buses was unconstitutional. Her bravery and courageous defiance won her the title of 'the mother of civil rights movement'. She is now remembered with high respect among all human rights activists.

Furthermore, to quote example from the distant past. The brave attitude showed by Socrates, an ancient philosopher in Athens is worthy of mentioning. When he was charged with corrupting the minds of the youth of Athen, the jury asked him to drink hemlock. He remained firmly intact on his stance and opted for drinking poison than to change his statement regarding the interpretation of wisdom.
