4) Belief in the Finality of Prophethood:

Belief in the finality of Prophethood is a pre-requisite for entering the fold of Islam. It means Muhammad (PBUH) is the last Prophet and there will be no prophets after him. Quran has testified the fact in the following words.
 "Muhammad is the last of prophets" [Al-Quran].

1) Testimony of the Last Prophethood from the past scriptures:

ii) Christianity:

The important book of Christians - Isaiah - has testified the arrival of Last Prophet:
 "The last Prophet will not know how to read and write."

→ Bahira Rahid had foretold the fact that Muhammad (PBUH) will be the last Prophet.

(ii) Judaism:

Deuteronomy - the important book of Judaism - validates the arrival of last Prophet in the following words:

"The last Prophet will be from Arabia and he will be the brother of Bani Israel."

(iii) Budhism

Gospel of Buddha - a highly praised ancient book of Budhism - quoted Buddha when he said that there ~~will~~^{would} come a person who would be more merciful than me.

2) Characteristics of the Finality of Prophet hood:

(i) Universality:

Just as Islam is a universal Deen; Similarly, Holy Prophet is the source

of guidance for the whole universe. As it has been said by the Prophet:

"I'm the Last Prophet and you are the last Ummah" [Hadith]

(ii) Perfection:

The last Prophet is the epitome of Perfection. People from all over the world can seek guidance from his life.

(iii) Perfection of Sunnah:

Allah has not preserved the life of any prophet but Muhammad (PBUH) because he was the last Prophet. The life of Holy Prophet (Sunnah) is preserved in the form of Siha-i-Sita.

(iv) Awarded the Holy Place of Mehmood:

Allah has promised the Holy Prophet to bestow

“Hopefully, Allah

holy place of Mehmood.” [Al-Qura]

(iv) Love of Prophet is essential part of Faith:

It is incumbent
upon all Muslims to
love the Holy Prophet.
It has been mentioned by
the Holy Prophet as:

“You can not be
a Muslim until you love
Holy Prophet (PBUH) more
than your children and
wealth.” [Hadith.]

(v) Annulment of the Previous Shari'ah:

Allah has made
all the other Shari'ahs
null and void. He enjoined
people to follow ^{only} the Shari'ah
of Holy Prophet.
“The one who select

religion other than Islam, will not be accepted and he will be at loss in the after-life." [Al-Quran].

3- Nature of Prophethood:

Allah had chosen people for prophethood. No body could acquire it by his own will. It has been mentioned in the book "Islam at a Glance", "Prophethood is not something that can be acquired by an effort. It is bestowed by Allah".

4- Evidence of the Doctrine of Prophethood from Quran:

Allah has said in the Quran:

"Muhammad is not the messenger of any of your men. But he is the seal of Prophets."

Life of an individual and Society:

(i) Ethical Guidance and Role Model:

Belief in the last Prophethood is important as it is the source of ethical guidance. Moreover, Holy Prophet is the best role model for humans. As it has been stated by Syed Qutb:

"In the ethical tapestry of Islam, the life of Holy Prophet is a guide for humanity in ethical and virtuous living."

(ii) Spiritual Enlightenment of individuals:

The teachings of Holy Prophet act as a light in the dark. As it has been mentioned in the Quran:

"Indeed there has come to you from Allah a light and a clear message" (Al-Quran)

(iii) Strengthening of Faith Through Acceptance:

Believe in the Doctrine of Prophethood helps in the strengthening of one's faith. Because people tend to follow Holy Prophet in their day to day life.

"Muhammad (PBUH) is the Last Prophet" [Al-Quran].

(iv) Advocacy for Social Justice and Equity

Belief in the Doctrine of prophethood helps in the establishment of social justice and equality. It has been mentioned in the Quran:

"We have sent Our messengers with signs, book and balance, so that the believers may stand forth in justice" [Al-Quran].
