Fourthly, the lack of support staff burdenize the existing staff diverting their focus from their learning and teaching job. Administrative tasks such as processing paperwork, scheduling, appointing, and handling students inquiries become overwhelming for the limited staff available. Fifthly, the shortage of permanent faculty members impact the quality of education provided to students. Adjunct faculty members, who are often hired as visiting faculty, lack the stability and commitment necessary to foster such long-term relationships with students and lack of result-oriented interactions.
