No specific amount is specified for sadka either. A person can give as much sadka as he wants according to his will. Through zakaat a person purifies his wealth. There are numerous social, moral and spiritual effects of zakaat which will be discussed below.

2) Social Effects of Sadka and Zakaat
Sadka and zakaat have profound impacts on a society including circulation of wealth, eradication of extreme poverty, increase in living standards, etc.

a) Circulation of Wealth

The system of sadka and zakaat ensure circulation of wealth. In this way, wealth does not accumulate among the few elites but instead

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it spreads across the society. The richer you are, the more zakat you will pay which ensure equity in a society.
