→ Colonized and Colonizer mindsets relies on the psychological framework of domination. Colonizers portrayed Colonized as advantage-takers of their governance, justifying their rule and barbarity. However, Colonized absorbed their norms while lingering between feeling of exploitation and advancement. The post-Colonizers may view the rule as a destruction of their culture, economy and liberty, while for Colonizers, it would be the downfall of their peak. Eventually, post-Colonizer's interpretation of their history is conflicted between emotions and ideas.
