a Double Circulation

Ans

Heart is majorly divided into two (2) main parts; left and right. The de-oxygenated blood goes to lungs via left-side of the heart, however, the oxygenated blood from lungs through the right-side of a heart goes to the entire body.

The first circulation of blood took place in left side of the heart and another circulation of oxygenated blood takes place majorly in the right side of heart where it is pumped to all body. Due to these two significant functions, it is termed a double circulation.

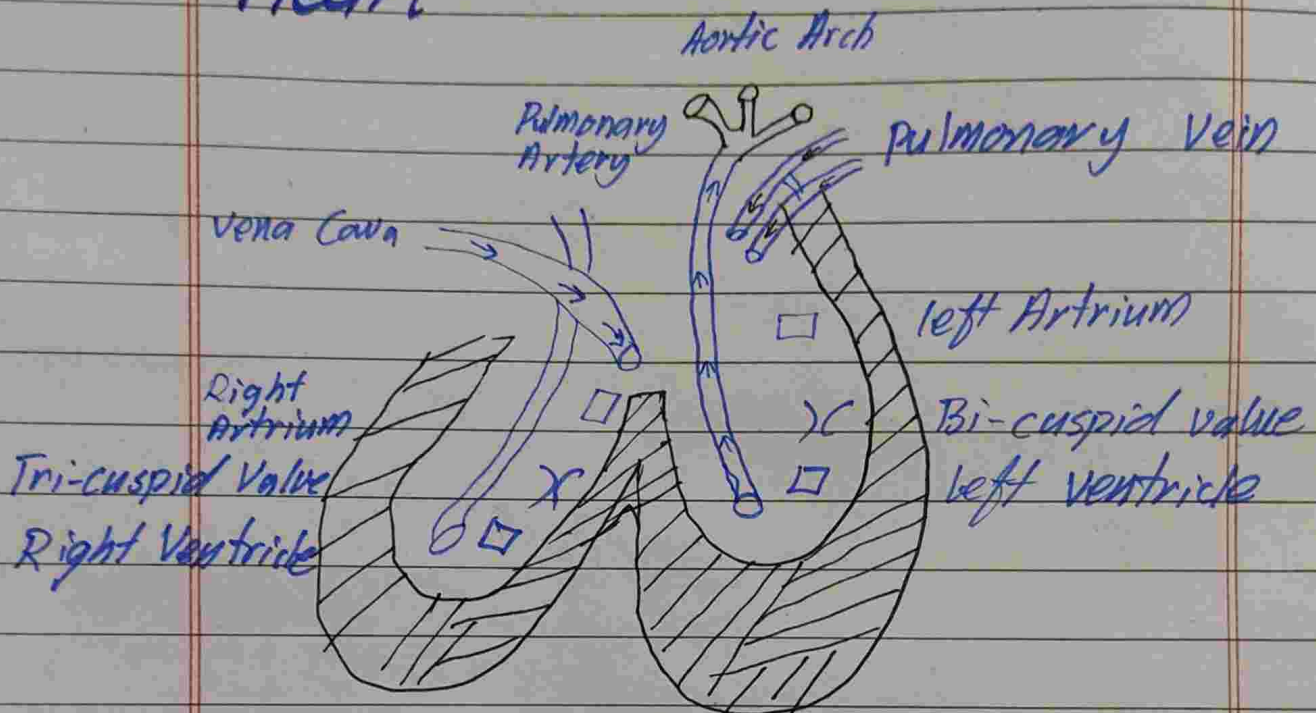
Further more, double circulation will be more expressed and explained in second portion of this answer that how the heart is doing double circulation.

How the heart is adapted to keep flowing in double circulation?

The double circulation

quality of a heart will be understood by knowing the function of it.

Heart



How it works:

A heart is a strong muscular organ which pumps the blood in body. It is source of sending and pumping the blood to the human body.

When the veins carry de-oxygenated blood towards a larger vein called, Vena Cava which pours-in the blood right atrium. Then heart contracts and blood moves forward to right ventricle. In between these chambers, the tri-cuspid valve

prevent the back-flow and blood flows into the right ventricle. Upon the contraction of right ventricle, the blood is pumped through pulmonary valve into pulmonary arteries which takes it to lungs. Here the first circulation gets completed.

Further more, the pulmonary vein carries oxygenated blood ^{upone} toward left atrium. Contraction, ~~of~~ left atrium pours-in the blood towards left ventricle.

The bi-cuspid valve prevents blood ~~to~~ back-flow. Upon contraction, left ventricle pumps it to main artery called Aorta which distribute it ~~into~~ in all body.

Here the 2nd circulation gets completed. The structure of a heart is designed in way that squeezes the de-oxygenated blood in and pumps the oxygenated blood out. It is how the heart is adopted to a double flow circulation in human body.

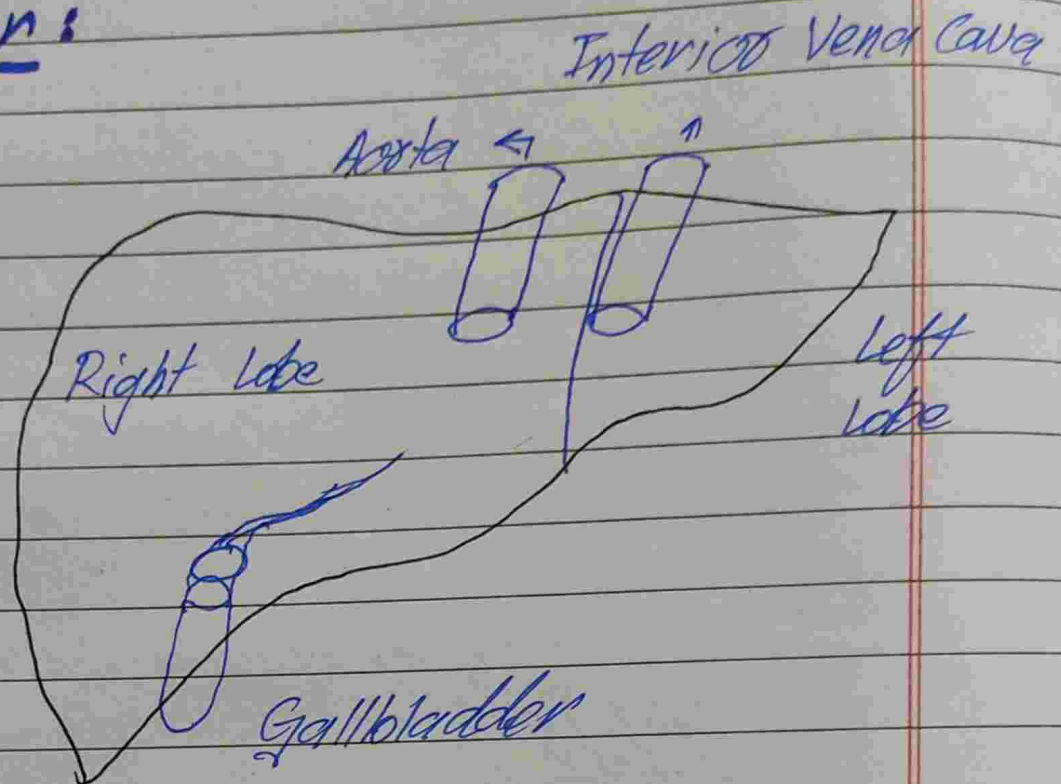
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b Liver as a Chief Chemist.

Functions of Liver as a Chief Chemist:

1. Metabolic Function:

3 Bile Production:

Liver is made up with two major lobe; right and the left. They contain blood vessels, gallbladder, aorta and inferior vena cava.

05 Gallbladder:

It is a storage of bile that helps in fats digestion mainly. It is useful but not essential for survival.



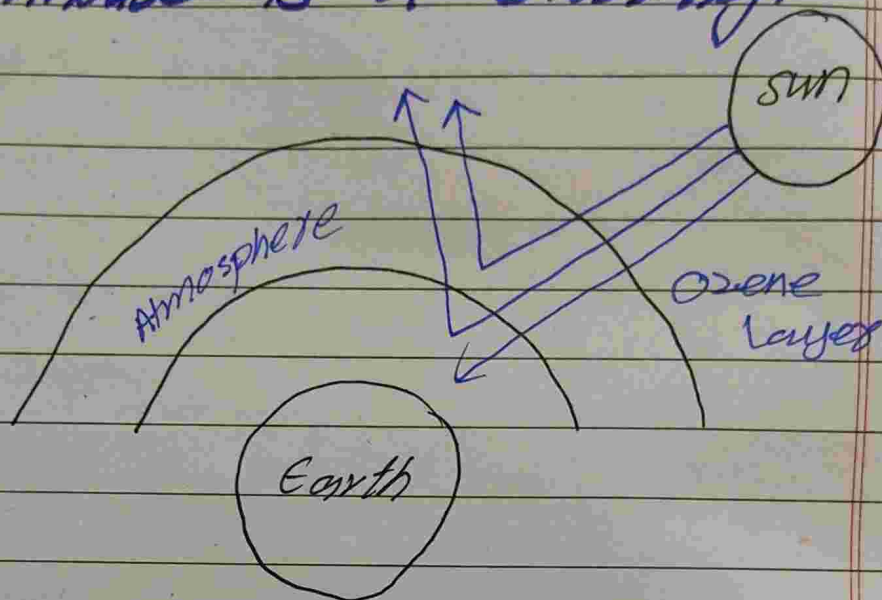
c Greenhouse effect as a Blessing:

Its effects are not only bound with environment, but also with societies and changing in them due to its effects.

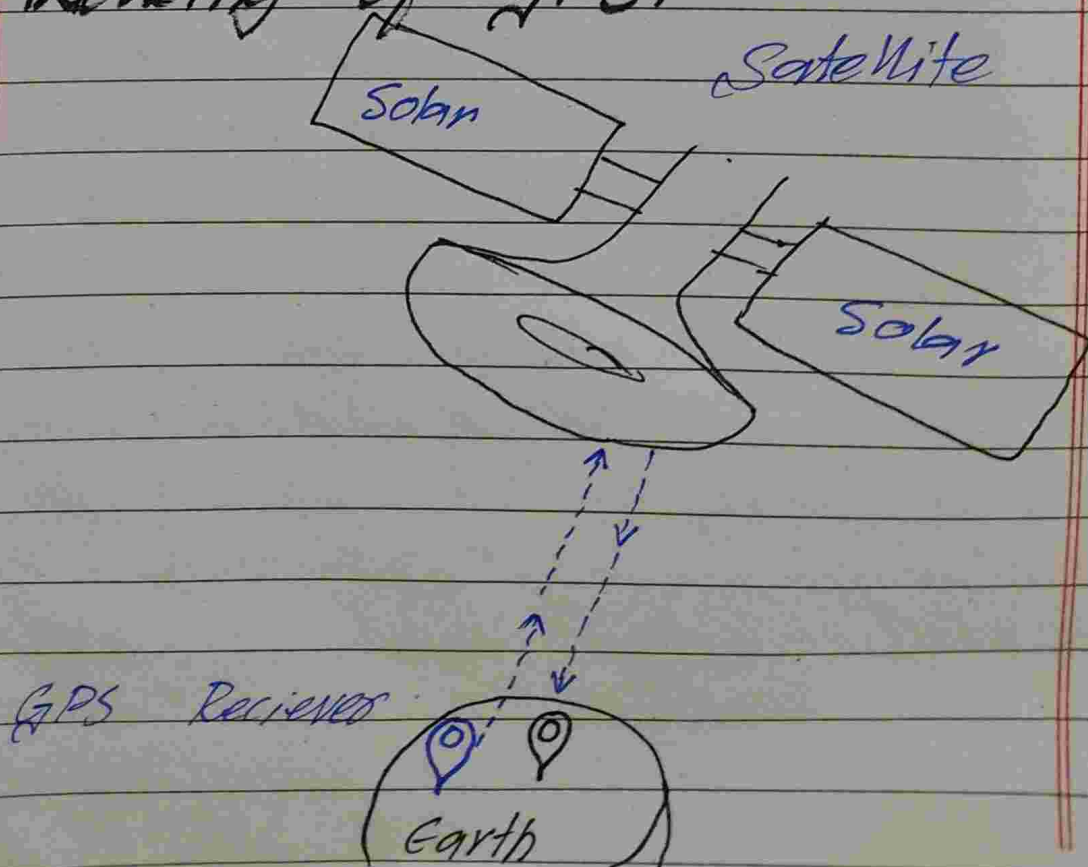
Its Relation to Global Warming:

Working of GPS:



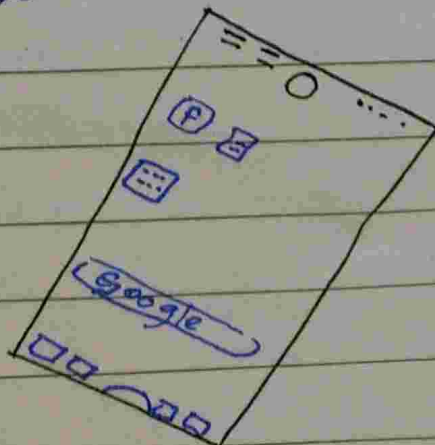
a) Working of GPS:

a) Open dumping:

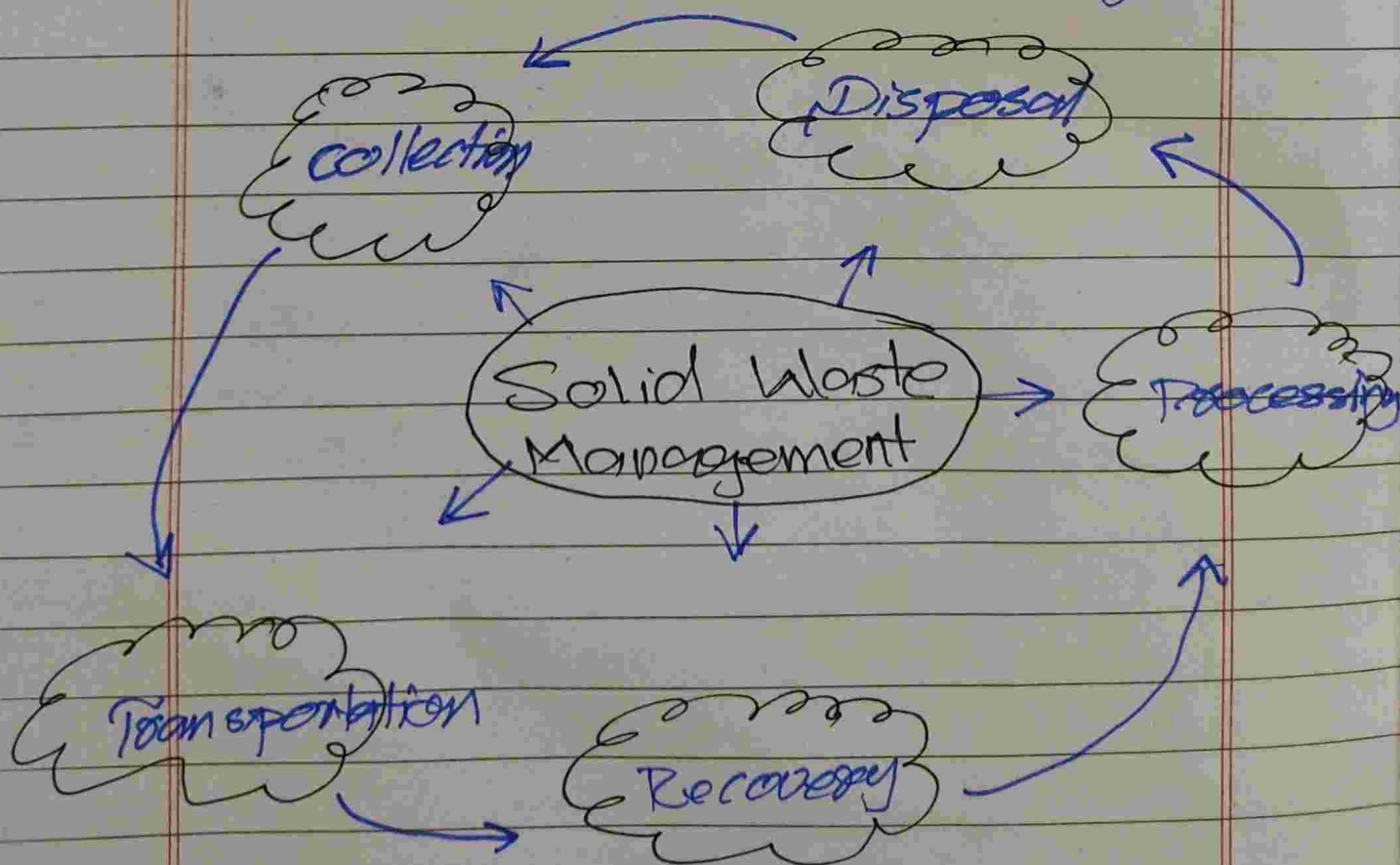
