Conclusion

Foreign policy chief of EU reported that, before war Gaza was the greatest open air prison, ^{Today} ~~now~~ it is the greatest open air graveyard. It begins when new state of Jews was established between Mediterranean sea and Jordan river. The area was divided by Balfor among Palestine and Israel, 55% for Israel, 44% for Palestine and 1% Jerusalem under Jordan. The conflict started by the expansion of Israel from 1948 to 1967. It caused decades of bloodshed from streets of Gaza to the hills of Jerusalem. Hamas and PLA is fighting for their land but supporters of Israel mentions them as 'terrorists', including USA who

has taken the charge of the defense of Israel. Israel has already occupied 70% of the area including 77% of Jerusalem and 35% of West Bank. Millions of Palestinians displaced and so many had lost their lives. They are trapped by all sides as Egypt closed the border including Rafah crossing. They have no way left behind to get freedom except seeing their death by their eyes. There is not even a single country helping them openly and who could dare to oppose Israel. The international community is not taking a serious step against Israel. It simply questions the claims of West, who considered themselves as the winner of human rights.
