(i) INTRODUCTION:-

After the independence, both India and Pakistan, have had a long and relationship, especially over the Kashmir issue. Again both nations have become heated up, after recent attacks on tourists in Pahalgam, a town in Indian illegal occupied Kashmir. India blamed Pakistan for the incident as it did in past, historically. Using this narrative, India has withdrawn from the Indus Water Treaty that was signed in 1960. This sudden move has created serious concerns for peace in region. Therefore, this reaction of India has distressed Pakistan to protect its water security and national interests.

(ii) CRITICAL : EVALUATION OF SITUATION

1. INDIA'S ACCUSATION:

India has history of blaming Pakistan for various incidents and conflicts without sufficient evidences. India again accused Pakistan for this Pahalgam attacks without any proper investigation. The focus on blaming Pakistan can be seen as a way of avoiding addressing root causes of conflicts, especially in Kashmir, where serious human rights abusive have been reported. 2. INDIA'S WITHDRAWAL FROM INDUS WATER TREATY:

The Indus Water Treaty was signed in 1960, regarding water distribution brokered by the World Bank, between Pakistan and India. In this treaty, ~~Pakistan~~ India took right on eastern rivers (the Beas, Ravi and Satluj) and Pakistan controlled western rivers (Indus, Jhelum, and Chenab). This treaty has survived during multiple wars and conflicts between two nations. However, India unilateral ~~with~~ withdrawal from this treaty, pressurized Pakistan over Kashmir issue.

3. STRATEGIC IMPLICATION FOR PAKISTAN

(A) WATER SECURITY THREATS:

According to World Resource Institute's 2023 report, Pakistan is the 4th most water stressed country. Therefore, India seems to be using water as a tool to pressure Pakistan. Pakistan is an agriculture country, contributing 24% of its GDP. India seeks to exploit Pakistan's vulnerability in economic development through this water war.

(B) DIPLOMATIC ISOLATION:-

India's diplomatic influence could also isolate Pakistan globally. India has consistently accused Pakistan of supporting and exporting

terrorism. Additionally, the USA and other western countries have shifted their strategic focus to India, viewing India as a key partner in the region. Therefore, it may contribute to India's efforts to isolate Pakistan.
