The perception of civil services in Pakistan has evolved significantly—once an administrative need has increasingly become an obsession, ambition and a venue for personal portrayals. At its onset, and even for many now, civil services is a great source of social stability and security and door opener for the power corridors; however, for some, it is an obsession and a 'do and die' game even at the cost of physical and mental well-being. The modern twist is more ironic: The civil servants have aggressively using social media to demonstrate personality cult and romanticise their struggle stories, often replacing traditional administrative practices. Some claim that they are more efficient on-camera than in the fields. Thus, the outcome of the evolution is hybrid: in societies where symbolism prevails, the image of the authority also become an authority, inspiring, obscuring
