Thirdly, In simple terms, education has increased income or employment opportunities for women helping them to gain greater economic independence and become self-sufficient.

Thirdly, it provides access to better healthcare services by increasing awareness of health issues related to gender.

Fourthly, education allows people to develop more nuanced and informed views and knowledge of gender roles in society, which can help them to challenge and reduce discrimination against women. Through education, one can challenge the harmful practices like early child marriage and female genital mutilation etc. By providing girls with same education as boys, societies can overcome gender-based stereotypes and inequalities.

Firstly, **Economic empowerment programs** such as financial assistance, vocational training programs etc for women. Government and NGOs may offer scholarships, stipends to help girls afford financial requirements for education, this will reduce burden on families.

Secondly, **gender-awareness programs** are much needed to highlight the benefit of educating women through media and digital platforms, challenging existing stigmas regarding female education.

Thirdly, we can **reduce domestic workload** on females by providing community resources like water points, mills etc.

Fourthly, providing **transportation** or constructing schools and centres of education in every town and village, so that all the girls can attend school to get education.

Fifthly, **develop and implement gender responsive curriculum** that removes stereotypes and promotes equality in learning and getting education.

Sixthly, **creating safe-environments** by the responsible authorities and

institutions and ensuring schools have safe facilities and are free from gender-based stereotypes and discriminations, so that people can trust on it.

Lastly, the role of media in highlighting the right of women to get education. According to "Article 26.

of Universal Declaration of Human Rights, everyone has the right to education and fundamental education be free and compulsory.
