Secondly, **gender-awareness programs** are much needed to highlight the benefit of educating women through media and digital platforms, challenging existing stigmas regarding female education.

Thirdly, we can **reduce domestic workload** on female by providing community resources like water points, mills etc.

Fourthly, providing **transportation** or constructing schools and centres of education in every town and village, so that all the girls can attend school to get education.

Fifthly, **develop and implement gender responsive curriculum** that removes stereotypes and promotes equality in learning and getting education.

Sixthly, **creating safe-environments** by the responsible authorities and



institutions and ensuring schools have safe facilities and are free from gender-based stereotypes and discriminations, so that people can trust on it.
