The philosophy behind zakat is that

rich ~~to~~ to poor. Allah has declared this act
a necessity so that poor don't remain
alienated. It ensures circulation of wealth
among rich and the poor. As Allah says
in Quran that,

So that it may not circulate
between the rich among you
[Al-Quran].

(ii) Purification of wealth as well as that
of soul

Almighty Allah pleases with those
who spend in the way of Allah. Zakat is
an Islamic way to purify one's wealth
as well as soul. Islam discourage hoarding
and seizing of wealth. Prophet (PBUH)

said that,

The biggest evil of my Ummah
is love ~~for~~ the wealth.

[Hadith]

Hence, when a person gives ~~a~~ zakat,
it implies that the person doesn't prioritize
wealth over his faith and in this way
purifies the wealth.

(iii) Zakat reflects the faith that sovereignty
over everything in the universe belongs
to Almighty Allah

The system of zakat implied
reflects that whatever a human poses either
it is wealth, money, property, health, social
status, belongs to Almighty Allah. As Allah
says in context of Quran,

Whatever is in the heavens and
whatever is in the earth, belongs
to Allah

3. Social Impacts of Zakat

(i) ^{Zakat} Reduces gap between rich and poor

Zakat ensures circulation of wealth among rich and poor. Whenever, the rich attains a certain amount of wealth, he is bound to give zakat, so that gaps of inequality of wealth reduce and a balance is maintained in the society.

(ii) Zakat addresses the resentments in heart of poor people

Huge differences of wealth and social status produces ~~resentments among~~ hearts of the poor. ~~Whenever~~ Whenever, the rich give zakat, it ~~reduces~~ those complaints about the rich ones. Hence, it produces well-being in the poor for rich ones.

1. Introduction

Holy Prophet (PBUH) ~~has~~ is an epitome for both diplomats and educators. His principles of diplomacy include priority of peace over war, sending delegations to other countries to give ~~involve~~ invitation to Islam, peaceful coexistence with different religions and historical agreements. Additionally, he was an ideal example of educator. His methods of teaching are ~~still~~ also accepted in western schools, such as giving practical examples of lectures, gradual delivery of knowledge so that his companions understand clearly. He used to give examples and sought active learning among his students, reflecting a perfect example ~~of~~ for his Ummah.

2. Sirah of Holy Prophet (PBUH) as a role model for diplomat

(a) Prophet (PBUH) always prioritized peace over war

Prophet (PBUH) never initiated war. He was a perfect example of humbleness.

humility and compassion. He always tried to maintain peace in the region. Whenever, he conquered Makkah, he declared general amnesty for all. Treaty of Hudaibiya signed b/w Quraysh of Makkah and Muslims, ~~of~~ making it ^{great} example. This treaty was not in favour of Muslim. In spite of loss, he signed the treaty and created an example for all his companions. Later, Allah revealed sign of victory (Surah Al-Fath) and declared his decision successful. As Allah says in context of Quran that;

O Mohammad! we have declared
clear victory for you
[Al-Quran]

(ii) Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) sent delegation to different kings to spread message of Islam

Prophet Muhammad used send delegation to different kings. For example king of Persia, Libya, Oman, Yemen, Syria. He sent delegations to establish peaceful relations and gave message of Islam. This was a

a great example of how he conducted relations among different countries. Therefore, he is a role model for today diplomats.

(iii) Prophet (PBUH) trained his companions as effective diplomats

Infidels of Makkah used to tease muslims and Prophet (PBUH). When their behavior became unbearable, Prophet (PBUH) sent 15 muslims to Abyssinia. The king of Abyssinia welcomed them but infidels tried to persuade him against muslim. However, Prophet (PBUH) had sent **Hazrat Jabbar Tajar** whose behavior and skills influenced the king. Hence, this indicates that prophet (PBUH) trained his companions in diplomacy in an effective way to spread message of Islam.

(iv) Pact of Madina - Another example of ideal diplomacy

When Muhammad migrated to Madina, there were Jews, idolators and Christians. Despite several religions, his diplomacy became successful when he signed an agreement with people of Madina. His diplomatic efforts led to peaceful coexistence among different religions.

Additionally, they also agreed for collective defence against any threat in Madinga. Contemporary example is **NATO (North Atlantic Treaty organization)** that is collective defence pact between America and European Union. However, this kind of alliance was formed in past by Muhammad through his utopian diplomatic efforts.

(v) Prophet (PBUH) made right decisions at right time - reflecting his intellectual ability in act of diplomacy

His analysis of situation and intellectual ability was laudable. Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) always made right decisions in all matters. His diplomatic skills were evident from the event that when Muslims had migrated to Abyssinia, the infidels made a plan to kill him, but Prophet was aware of their plans and he himself migrated in 622 A.D. along with his companion Hazrat Abu Bakr (R.A). Hence, the Sirah of Muhammad (PBUH) was a role model for diplomat.

3. Sirah of Holy Prophet (PBUH) as role model for an educator

(i) Prophet (PBUH) was sent as an educator for his Ummah

Prophet (PBUH) used to encourage good morals, character and welfare of people. Muslims believe that his message was divine. Prophet (PBUH) gave guidance to live life according to teachings of Holy Quran. Angel Gabriel was sent to him who gave his message of Allah to preach Islam. He became a role model as an educator for his whole universe through his perfect skills of pedagogue.

(ii) Aims of Prophetic teaching

The purpose of his teaching, to spread message of Allah and guide people to carry out their life activities according to teachings of Islam. His message was divine. He encourage good morals, justice, honesty, trustworthiness, patience, humility, compassion and humble behaviour towards everyone. Prophet (PBUH) said that,

Fear Allah wherever you are and follow after bad deeds the good deeds to wipe them out and always behave towards people with good character.

(iv) Unique methods of teachings of Holy prophet (PBUH)

(a) He used to repeat every teaching so that his students learn it.

(b) He used to give examples on every lesson and ~~ought to~~ teach his companions in perfect manner. Once he gave example of bathing in river for 5 times to clear ~~concept~~ of how prayer wipes sins of human beings by offering it 5 times.

(c) He used to call names of students and engage them in discussions so that they learn effectively.

(d) He used to make gestures to teach. Once prophet (PBUH) raise his index fingers and middle ~~fig~~ finger and hold them

together and said one of who takes care of an orphan will be like this with me at the day of resurrection. His method of teaching was a perfect example for people all over the universe.

(e) He used to speak ~~gr~~ slowly so that his companions could learn and understand. Once **Hazrat Aisha (R.A)** said that prophet (PBUH) talks ~~so~~ gradually that one can easily count his words before speaking. Gradually he advanced his lessons.

(f) Prophet (PBUH) used to practice ^{himself} before teaching anything so that his companions and other muslim follow him.

Hence, his Sirah was a role model as an educator. Today the modern teaching methods are similar which prophet (Muhammad) used to practice 1100 years ago, demonstrating his perfectness.

1. Political System of Islam

In Islamic political system is a blend of both capitalism and communism. In this system, sovereignty belongs to Allah and man is the vicegerent of Allah. It consists of vital elements such as justice, consultation, election of Khalifa, Rule of law, enjoining right and forbidding the wrong and following the commandment of the leader. Additionally, in Islamic state, no legislation can be done against teachings of Holy Quran and Sunnah. Modern state system was developed with foundational elements from Islamic system.

2. Vital Elements of Political System of Islam

(i) Sovereignty belongs to Allah Almighty

In an Islamic political system, sovereignty of everything belongs to Allah. He is the supreme leader and guider. Everything in an Islamic state

is conducted according to his teachings given in Quran and Sunnah of his beloved Prophet (PBUH). As Allah says that

But who is better than Allah for people in judgement

[Al-Quran]

(ii) Man is the vicegerent of Allah in an Islamic political system

Allah has sent human beings as his vicegerent. As Allah says in Quran that,

We have appointed you as their successor in the earth

[Al-Quran]

(iii) Following the commandments of the leader

The leaders in Islamic political system are appointed on the basis of their morality, conduct and leadership skills.

People are advised to follow his commandments until those are according to teachings of Islam. If the leader deviates away from Islam, then there is no compulsion of following him.

(iv) No legislation against Holy Quran and Sunnah

If legislation passed against teachings of Holy Quran and Sunnah, then the state can't be called an Islamic state.

(v) System of Consultation

Sahaba (companions) of Prophet (PBUH) and Muhammad himself used to consult in the matter. It is like a democratic principle of modern states. Allah says in Quran that,

And conduct their affairs in consultation
[Al-Quran]

(vi) System of Justice

Justice is an integral component of Islamic political system. The judge has been ordained to do justice without hesitation. The example of justice is that Hazrat Ali (RA) presented himself before court when a Jew claimed ownership of the armour. He set example of justice. Similarly, Allah says in Holy Quran,

If you judge, judge between them with justice. Allah loves those who act justly
[Al-Quran]

(vii) Equality

In Islamic political system everyone is equal irrespective of their religion, Caste, colour and social justice. Allah says that all human beings are equal because they all are from one (Adam) and they are all created by Allah.

(viii) Freedom in practice of religion

Allah says that no one can force anyone in choice of religion. In Islamic political system, there is freedom of religion choice. One can practice any religion without any force. As Allah says in Quran that,

There is no compulsion in choice of religion [Al-Quran].

(ix) Enjoining the right and forbidding the evil

Allah has made this obligatory on every muslim to preach right and reject evil. Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) said that,

Raising voice against tyrant is Jihad

[Hadith].

3. How islamic political system played role in the development of modern state craft

Modern states developed certain laws recently. For example, system of justice, democracy, legislation, religious freedom, and equality. These laws have been formulated by the western organizations recently. However, islam had already provided these principles to their Ummah 1400 years ago. Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) and companions practised these principles and established islamic political system. Hazrat Umar (R.A) established courts and system of administration in past. Democracy in modern statecraft is based on consultation principle. Hence, islamic political system played a role in development of modern statecraft.
