Political fake news and propagandas involves maligning election campaigns, spreading lies about rival politicians or candidates. As of 2025, 5.24 billion people, approximately 63.9% of global people population uses social media actively. Any fake news news reaches this much people within seconds. Moreover, no systematic fact checking of news on social media. It makes any kind of news accessible to everyone. Secondly the algorithm driven echo chambers of social media, where the users get ^{content} recommended on the basis of likes their liking and trends with no credibility checks in between and no opposing narrative ^{against their liking} recommended on their feeds. ^{these days has} Everyone having cellphones, which gives them access to record and upload whatever, ^{with} no context and journalism insight ~~now~~ on social media to be seen by people other users and create confusion.
