However now it has become another capitalistic venture. The price of education, specially in university has significantly increased. Students are no longer willing to pay so much fees when they do not even have the promise of a job towards the end.

The Student loan have left many of their parents and older generation in crippling debt - so now they refuse to be part of the problem.

An answer, out of this debt, has been the new wave of 'entrepreneurial mindset' among youngsters. They prefer to dedicate themselves to businesses than to that can make them money than invest so many years and money into an academic qualifications.

A by-product of this mindset has been the recent emphasis of 'Skill over Degree' in the Job market. Employers are now more focused if one has skills rather than a piece of paper or a GPA. This focus on skills has enabled a lot of students to skip dedicating years to a 'Degree', develop required skill in some months and land a job.

The recent shift in Job Market requirements is also because of the economic instability youth today is facing. The cost of living has never been this high before. Around 1 out of 4 youngsters can afford buying a house as compared to 1975, when 4 out of 4 youngsters could buy a house. The economic instability has pushed students into 'survival mode' where they prioritize making money and becoming stable more than investing in education and pursuing interests.

Unemployment is also a contributor towards this trend. The students who have graduated from universities are not only under student loan but also are unemployed. This does not help encourage the youth to explore academic interests.

Keeping all these points in mind, it is imperative to discuss where the student interests are going if they are swayed away from education.

Firstly, as discussed above, students are more eager to develop a business than work a job. To have a business, you do not require an academic qualification.

Secondly, there is a huge role social media has played towards this. The increasing use

and influence of Social Media has opened new opportunities for people. Businesses have found a new platform to utilize while people have become 'brand' themselves calling it 'influencers'. When students see their peers earning six digits on social media by promoting some products, they are less likely to want to pursue education which may or may not land them a job.

A lot of this new debate or behavior towards University education is the influence of Gen 2 and their unique way of perceiving things. Gen 2 believe to have learned from previous generations and don't believe in 'corporate slavery' or the idea of 'owning a home' and 'student loans'. They believe in making money to survive and have a good time. This attitude has led to more comfort based easy jobs - such as work from home etc. AI has also played a great role in furthering Gen 2 influence. The recent wave of AI and ChatGPT models have influenced more focus on skill based job opportunities than formal education.

Covid and the layoffs exposed how fragile the economy is and that there is no job security. The ideas of 'work from home' and 'wasteful degrees'

The choice of spending 6 months taking a course from websites like 'Udemy' or 'Coursera' seems more plausible to students than spending 4 years.

After all this discussion, the question arises that what can one do to shift the focus back towards academics. There are a couple of things that can be done, such as making education affordable, improving economic situation, incentivizing a degree and encouraging curiosity in students again.
