1. INTRODUCTION

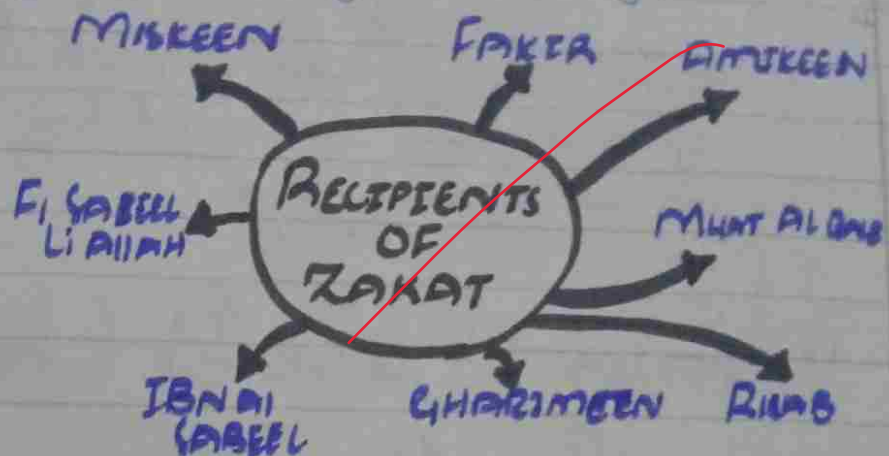
2. INTRODUCTION

SECONDARY SOURCES OF SHARIAH

1. INTRODUCTION
