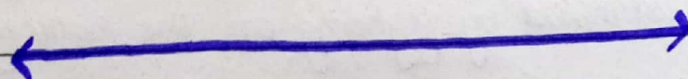

(Q3 part 4)

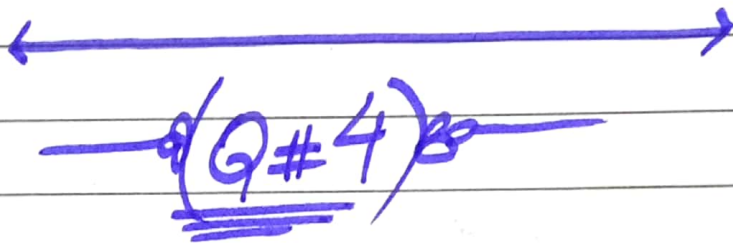

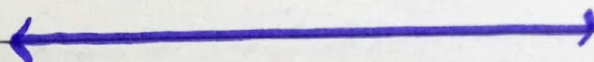
