The classic example of this fallacy is a scene in a British court of law, where a defence attorney is advised to attack the plaintiff's lawyer instead of the case. Abraham ~~Linch~~ Lincoln famously used a clever, non-malicious ad hominem in a jury trial by highlighting his opponent backward-buttoned shirt to sway the jury, despite being outmatched on legal points. The fallacy has ancient roots, likely used by the sophists. Historical

Political examples include attack on presidents Eisenhower and Roosevelt, where opponents targeted the individuals rather than policies, illustrating a harmful form of ad-hominem.
