Ad Hominem in Courts and Politics

The author is describing the fallacious ad hominem in a British court of law where a lawyer attacks his opponent personally when he cannot counter the argument.

A famous incident from Lincoln's early career shows how cleverly he won case against his opponent by mocking his ^{unusual} way of wearing shirt instead of addressing legal points. This fallacy is ancient, used widely by since the time of Sophists.

The author notes that while personal considerations such as the health of Presidents Eisenhower and Roosevelt's were legitimate issues, attacking personally

Roosevelt's policies just because he was a cripple - according to them - was a vicious form of ad hominem. This passage highlights how personal attacks divert attention from real issues and mislead judgement.
