PRECISE

Lincoln was a young lawyer in a British court of law. He got prominence for devising the phenomenon of a hominem. This phenomenon makes one accountable for personal fault-lines apart from professional one. Lincoln firstly used this against his opponent attorney. Although his opponent was well-equipped with legal knowledge, he failed

to adopt appropriate manner of wearing shirt. Lincoln used this as a Critique against him. He raised reservations on his opponent's credibility. This critique of Lincoln was also favoured by the judge. Ultimately, he won the case on the ground of ad hominem. Likewise, this precedent was later harnessed by numerous people. Sophists used it freely. Similarly, two Presidents of America became victims of ad hominem. The health of President Eisenhower fell in its domain. Likewise, critics aligned Frank Roosevelt with wrong government policies with this phenomenon of ad hominem. Hence, Lincoln's ad hominem persisted for a long time.
