The various causes of the civil war in America.

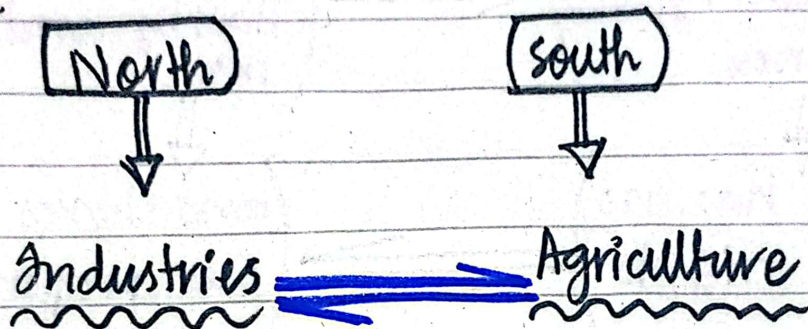
1.1) Social causes of the American civil war:

The social causes of the American civil war, was the division of North and South. North was free state. However, south was slave state.

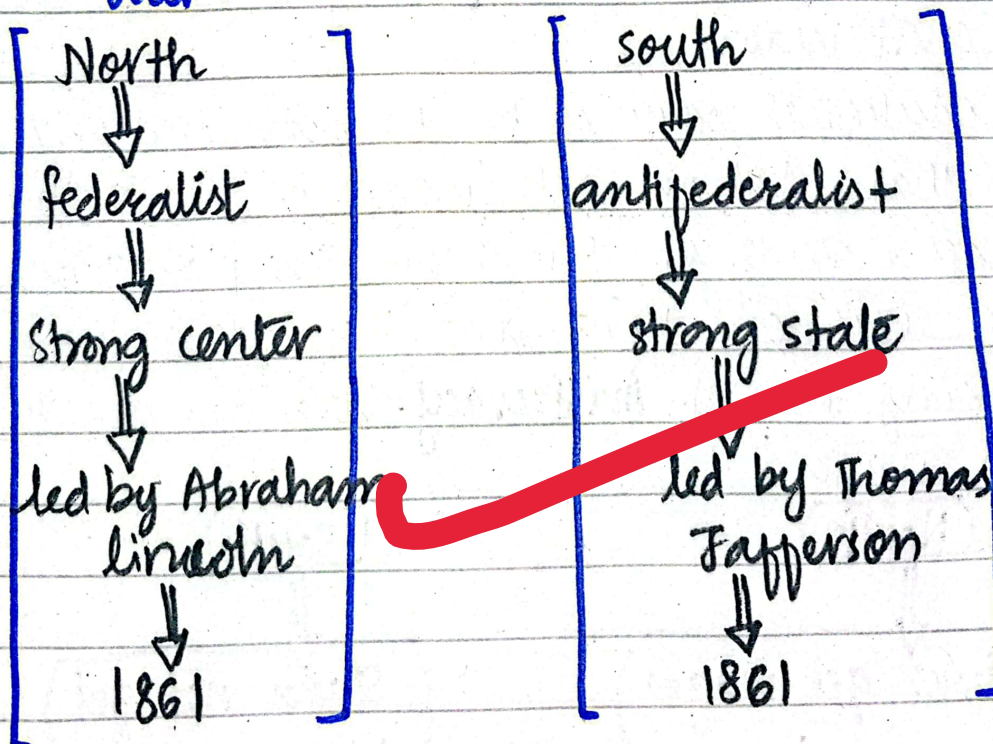


1.2) Economic cause of the American civil war:

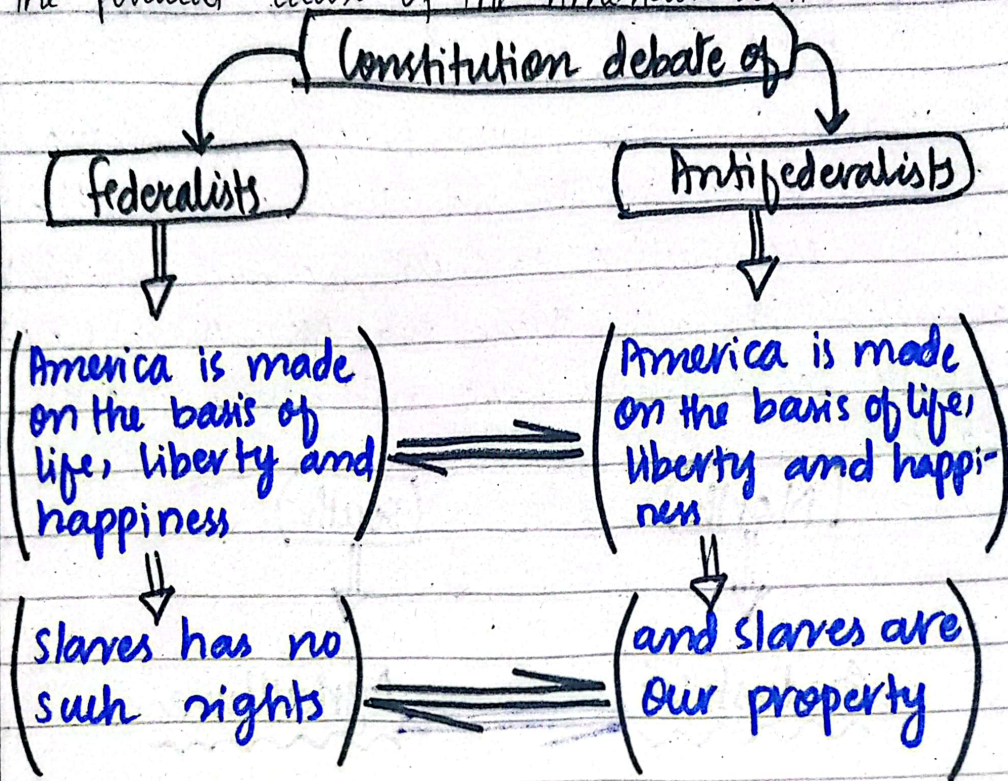
The economic cause of the American civil war was that the North was having industries which were paying to their workers who work. However; in south there was Agricultural based economy and slaves were not given their wages.



1.3) Political cause of the American civil war:

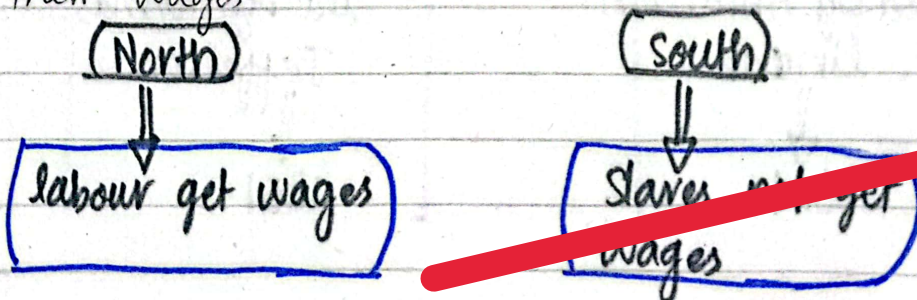


The political cause of the American civil war was:

Introduction: Monroe Doctrine and Manifest Destiny shaped the foreign policy of United States of America. Monroe Doctrine states that Europe should not intervene, not colonize in new land, US would defend itself against any war, and this doctrine had infiltrated self awareness and nationalism in American population. However, Manifest destiny was given by John O'Sullivan; under this doctrine it was

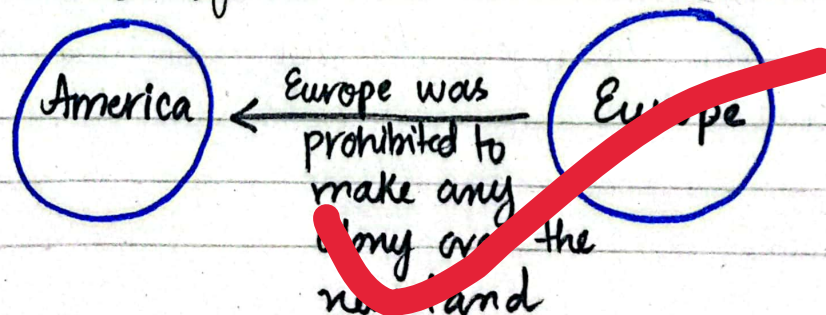
stated that America will annex and expand its territory. After that Mexico was annexed by the new president "Polk". These doctrines shaped American policies and still they are followed such as U.S. hegemony over Indo-Pacific Ocean and recent crisis in the middle East such as Israel, Iran conflict and Gaza war.

1. Monroe Doctrine: Monroe Doctrine was based on the following postulates for the foreign policy of America such as:

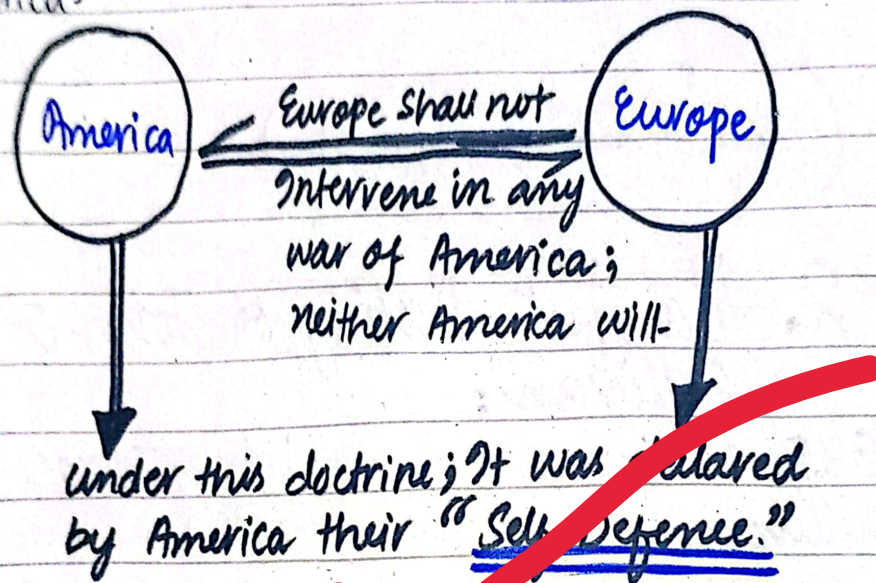
1.1) Non intervention of Europe:

- The Monroe doctrine states that Europe cannot intervene in the internal matters of America. And nor America will intervene in the internal matters of Europe.

1.2) anticolonization: It was stated by America in this doctrine that Europe cannot further make any of the colonies in the new land. Under this doctrine, Europe was prohibited to make any colony over the land of America.

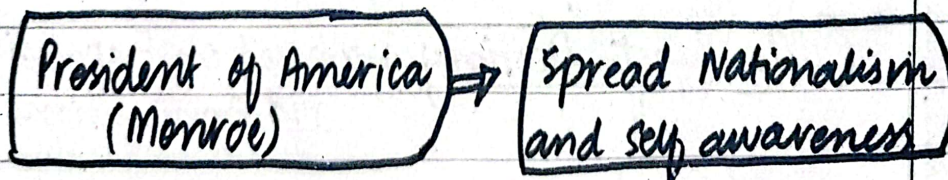


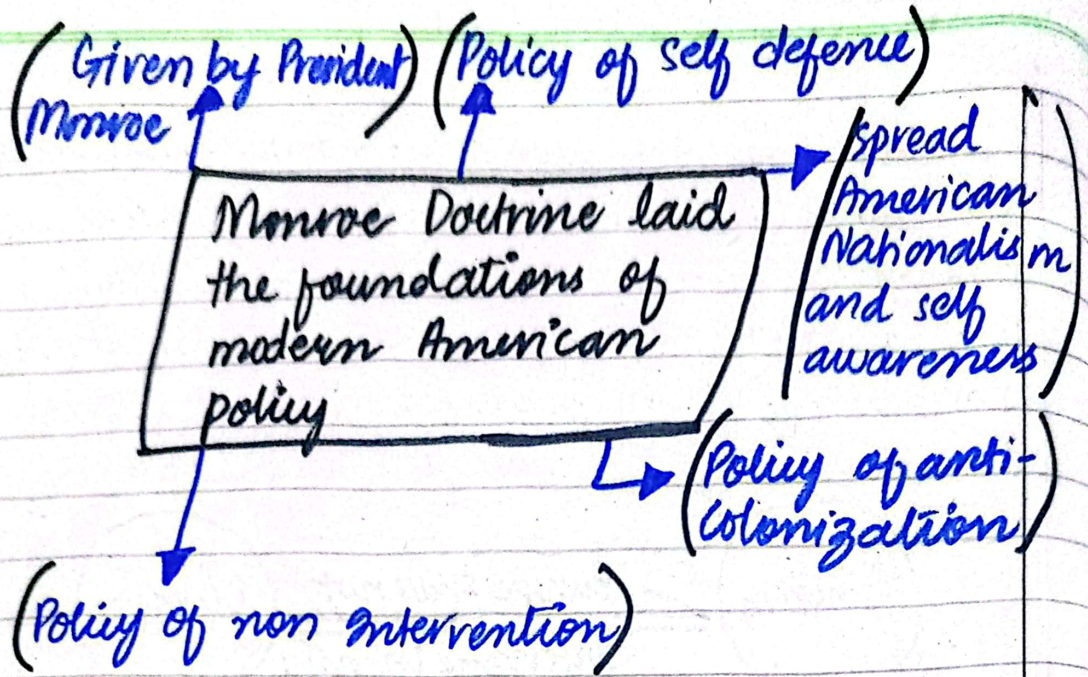
1.3) self defense: under this doctrine; it was stated that America will defend itself against any war. Europe will not intervene. Neither America shall intervene in any war of Europe; nor Europe shall intervene in any war of America.



1.4) American Nationalism and self awareness:

Under this doctrine; Monroe has infiltrated self awareness and awakened Nationalism inside America and detached itself from European involvements and hegemony.





2. Manifest Destiny of John O' Sullivan:

In 1845; Manifest Destiny was given by John O' Sullivan, a newspaper editor. He has given this manifest destiny to promote westward expansion.

Later; in 1845-1846 elections occurred and Polk won the election.

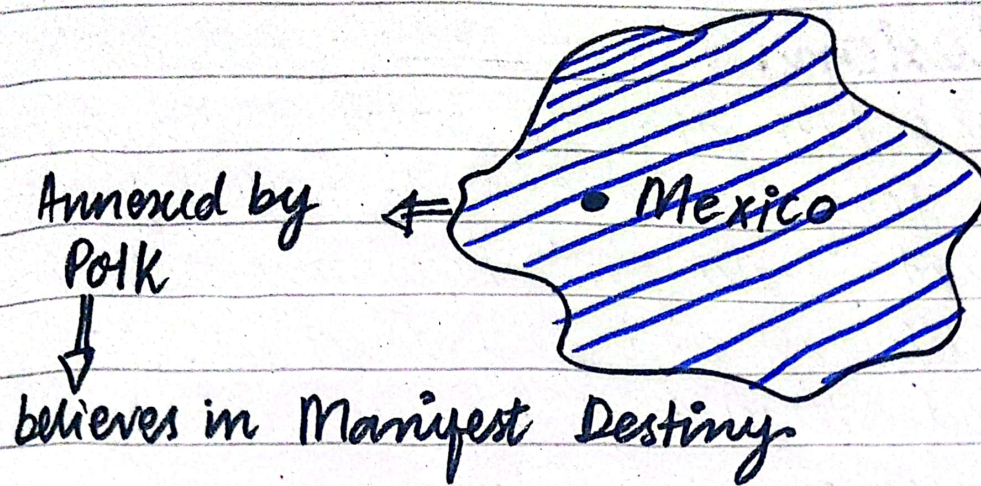
"Hurry with Polk and annexation"

3. Current U.S Strategic behaviour in the Indo-pacific, Middle east and latin America in relation to Monroe Doctrine and Manifest Destiny:

- **Strategic behaviour of US in the Indo-pacific:** United states want to have control over the Indo-pacific; accessing sea completely US can get complete control over trade.

However, other countries are also dependent on Indo-pacific for their trades. But, US under Manifest destiny want to have on its part.

- **strategic behaviour of US in the Middle East:**

Israel war with Gaza, Iran Israel conflict US has complete hegemony; and controlling all the conflicts of Middle East by having allies on its side, such as Israel.

Introduction: The Great Depression had caused severe and drastic impacts over the Economy of United States of America. Therefore, New Deal was put forward. This Deal consist of several acts such as Federal Emergency relief act, Civil works Administration act, federal housing authority act, Reconstruction finance Commission act, Agriculture Adjustment act, Emergency banking act, and Security and Exchange Commission act. All these acts were based on different plans to give loans, started

Employment, making houses, and different reforms in the Agricultural side. However, Watergate scandal had left drastic effects because it exposed the president's scandal of Watergate that is Richard Nixon.

1. Note on the New Deal as a response to Systematic crisis:

After great Depression in the US; New Deal was put forward to tackle with great depression. In this deal different acts were put forward:

1) FEERA Act: Federal Emergency relief

Act: This act provided relief of Employment to citizens.

2) Civil works administration act was passed:

This act has started building roads, buildings and houses for the citizens.

3) CCC: Civilian Conservation Cost act:

This act started construction of ~~houses~~ trees; and those citizens who are involved in the plantation drive of trees get \$1 dollar daily.

4) FHA: federal housing authority act:

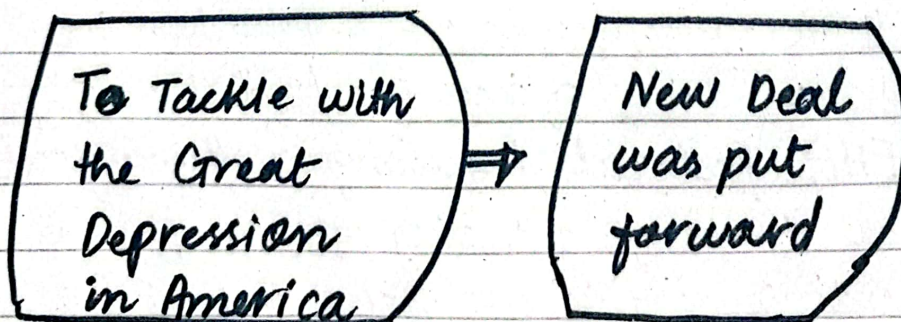
Federal housing authority act was passed. According to this act houses were built and Employment opportunities were given to citizens.

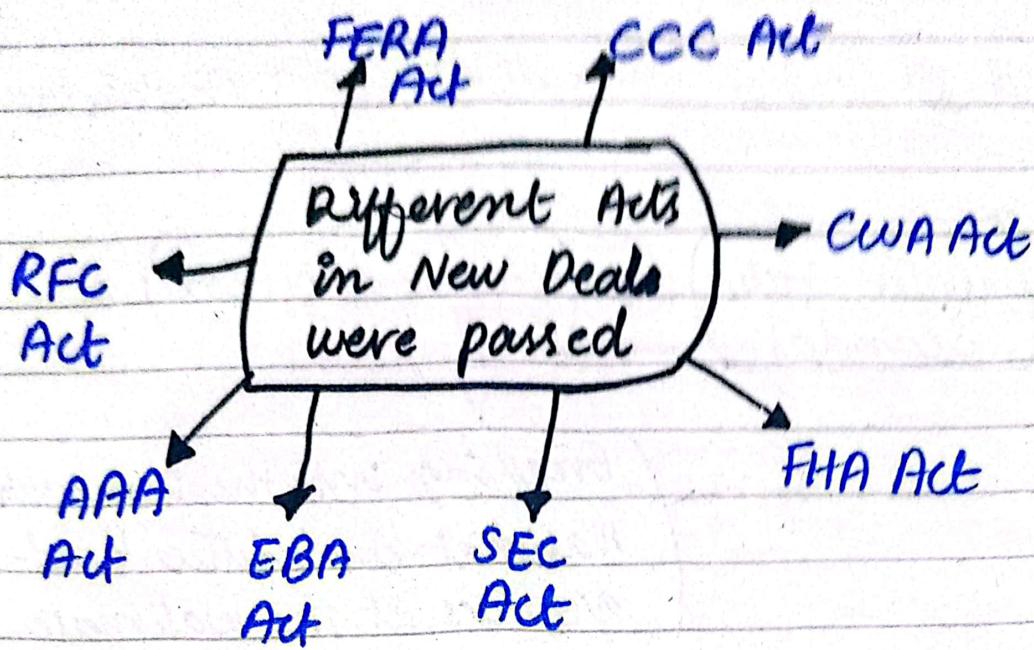
5) Reconstruction finance commission act (RFC): This act provided \$10 billion dollar loans to citizens.

6) Agriculture Adjustment Act:
According to this act production was decreased and wages were increased of farmers.

7) Emergency banking act: In new deal another act was passed to provide emergency loans to citizens called Emergency banking act.

8) Security and Exchange Commission:
Security and Exchange Commission was created for stock market.





2. Note on watergate and the evolution of public trust in Government:

There were series of events occurred between 1972 to 1974. In these series of events; water gate scandal was one of them.

The President of America **Richard Nixon** was responsible for the watergate Scandal.
