How Pakistan could balance its relations after the recent engagement with US and strategic partnership with China.

Introduction

**China Partnership:** Leverage long-term strategic projects like China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), infrastructure development, and military modernization.

## 2. Clearly Define Strategic Interests

Pakistan needs to differentiate between areas where it can cooperate with both countries versus areas of potential conflict.

**Defence and Security:** Both the US and China offer military support, but Pakistan may have to diversify procurement and technology sources to avoid dependency.

**Economic Development:** China is more patient with long-term infrastructure investment (like CPEC), whereas US aid may be more conditional and politically tied.

**Regional Diplomacy:** Pakistan's role in Afghanistan, India-Pakistan relations, and the Middle East requires careful messaging to avoid alienating either the US or China.

### 3. Leverage Economic Complementarities

**China:** Focus on large-scale infrastructure, energy, and industrial projects. Maintain CPEC momentum to secure economic growth.

#### 4. Engage in Strategic Signaling

**To China:** Reinforce commitment to Belt and Road initiatives and strategic alignment.

**To U.S.:** Emphasize counterterrorism cooperation, regional stability, and willingness to engage on global issues like climate change and humanitarian relief.

Being overly dependent on any single external actor is risky. Pakistan can strengthen its bargaining position by:
