A classic example came from courts, where lawyers sometimes try to discredit their opponent rather than focus on the case. Even Lincoln, as a young lawyer, used this tactic ~~cleverly~~ cleverly, as he was weaker on legal points. While ad hominem can be tactically smart, it can also be malicious. Critics of president Roosevelt and Eisenhower attacked them personally rather than evaluating their policies. This
