An anecdote from Lincoln's early legal career illustrates a ~~clear~~ but harmless use of this approach, noticing his opponent's odd back-buttoned shirt, Lincoln subtly played on the jury's prejudices to undermine the lawyer's ~~credibility~~ credibility and win the case.
