Classic example of fallacy in British court of law is when attorneys use ad-hominem, discrediting opposing lawyer, instead of ad-rem, facing the issue. Lincoln in one of his cases used ad-hominem against his opponent, a strong and experienced lawyer, when loosing the case; his opponent removed his vest and coat which exposed his back-buttoned shirt; Lincoln persuaded that he does not even know how to wear a shirt; this made him win the case. This is also used in elections, for instance, Eisenhower's health during 1956 nominations were made Ad-hominem that he could not serve another tenure; policies of Franklin Roosevelt also faced the same fate.
