The fallacy ad hominem occurs when an argument is attacked by discrediting the person presenting it rather than addressing the issue itself. A British courtroom illustrates this tactic with the advice to attack the opponent when lacking a case. Abraham Lincoln, as a young lawyer, cleverly used this method by mocking his opponents' shirt to sway a frontier jury, winning the case despite weaker legal points! This tactic has existed since the Sophists and persists in politics. For example, critics dismissed policies by ridiculing a leader's disability, showing the fallacy's enduring presence.
