This fallacy is prominent in British court of law's scenario, when when the defense takes floor, he gets a note saying, "instead of facing it use back door. If the argument can't be twisted just abuse the opponent, ad hominem. Lincoln, a young lawyer, in his earlier cases he displayed ad hominem tactic. As the opponent was experienced but Lincoln was unaffected.

The dressing of opponent made his eyes gleamed. He was wearing 1840's styled shirt, buttoned up at back. When Lincoln came forward, his plea was brief: "Gentlemen, I have justice on my side. This pretended knowledge can't influence you when doesn't know which side ought to be front. Lincoln ad hominem won the case.

This fallacy of overgeneralizing, has been used for long time and evident

in sophists, 1956 nomination of health minister and in 1944, Roosevelt's case, when he was charged for his policies that all were vicious kind of ad hominem.

Ad hominem: Fallacy instead of Argument.
